Invitation to a Holy Lent



St. Catherine's has much to offer during this reflective season. As we prepare ourselves for the Passion of Holy Week we will offer the following programs to all:

- **Tuesday Morning Eucharist/Study, 7am**

We meet in the sanctuary at 7 am for Eucharist followed by a study based on Mitch Albom's "Have a Little Faith," in the conference room until 8:00am. Led by Rev. Jim Nixon.

- **Wednesday Morning Meditation and Labyrinth, 7:30 am**

You are invited to spend a quiet hour walking the labyrinth and meditating on a reflection for the day. The morning begins at 7:30am at the labyrinth in front of the church with a prayer, followed by quiet time to walk and meditate, and ends at 8:30 with a prayer. You are welcome to come and go at any time between 7:30 and 8:30 am. The labyrinth is always open for personal prayer and meditation. Led by Amelia Arthur.

- **Stations of the Cross, ongoing**

The Outdoor Stations of the Cross are self guided and begin directly to the right of the church doors (facing the church). The stations are set up around the church property and the guide, available at the first station, has the locations of all the stations. The Indoor Stations on the walls of the main sanctuary of the church and begin on the right hand rear of the nave.

- **"Fearless" Series, Sundays 10 am OR Wednesdays 6:30 pm**

"Fearless" is our study which focuses on Max Lucado's book by the same title. It is offered at your choice of two times: Sunday mornings at 10 am led by Rev. Susan Johnson OR Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm led by Rev. Jim Nixon. If you can't make either time, we invite you to do individual study, a syllabus is available on the Lenten Resource Table in the foyer. You may obtain this book from your own sources or order it from church at \$20 (scholarships available to cover a portion of the cost).

Walking with the Spirit

The summer between my junior and senior years in high school I traveled to the Black Hills of South Dakota and spent two weeks at Borderlands Ranch building a labyrinth. It was an incredible experience, and one that was much more spiritual than I had imagined beforehand. Two weeks of moving rocks, digging in the dirt with my hands, and watching the labyrinth take shape connected me to the land. I developed a routine of praying as I worked, and later, after the labyrinth was finished, continued that routine of prayer as I walked the labyrinth each morning until I left.

Like many people before me, I found that walking and praying at the same time con-

nected me to God in profound ways. Each morning as I walked the labyrinth and the wind came over the prairie around me it was as if the Spirit was there walking with me.

For centuries Christians have physically walked, on labyrinths, pilgrimage trails, and prayer paths, and prayed or meditated as they did so. The labyrinth at St. Catherine's provides us a physical place to take intentional time to pray and to be quiet. During this season of Lent I will be taking that time on Wednesday mornings (7:30-8:30 am), I hope you can join me, or take time on your own to walk the labyrinth.

Fact: 15,200,000 children around the world have been orphaned by AIDS/HIV.

Fact: How much did you spend on a meal today? 3 billion people (1/2 the world's population) lives on less than \$2.50 a day.

Fact: 25,000 children die each day due to poverty.

Use your spare change to make a difference in the lives of orphan children worldwide made vulnerable by disasters, HIV/AIDS, poverty, and other circumstances. Pick up a plastic "rice bowl" to collect your change, from the church foyer or by the preschool office. Orphanage locations supported by Ricebowls:

- *Haiti: After the earthquake their established orphanage had to relocate temporarily. They are currently looking for property to build a new orphanage.*
- *India: 35 million orphaned in India. 35 million = the population of California*
- *South Africa: 1 in 5 South African children / 3.1 million children orphaned.*

2011 Pilgrimage

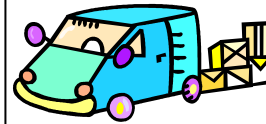

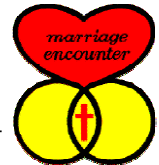

Episcopal Relief & Development Update

Thank you for your abundantly generous donations to Episcopal Relief and Development. St. Catherine's sent \$3,434.70 in relief to the earthquake victims of Haiti. ERD was in an established relationship with the Diocese of Haiti prior to the disaster and this has helped in collaborating the efforts and financial resources from Episcopalians worldwide. ERD has supplied water, food, vehicles and fuel for the vehicles to deliver the supplies to 23 diocesan camps. Camping supplies are also being sent to provide shelter for the 25,000 survivors living in these camps. The Diocese of Haiti has been able to provide clean water sites at eight camps because of the support of ERD. Emergency water purification systems are also being installed and maintained in additional camps. Not only is this providing the necessary water, it is creating jobs for many Haitians.

The Mandate for Episcopal Relief and Development is from Matthew 25: 37-40.

Hints on Living Longer

Strength training combined with cardiovascular exercise can actually slow down aging. If you exercise moderately, it is possible for you to add 1½ years to your life. If you exercise vigorously, you may be able to add about three years to your life.



Strength training can take the form of water aerobics, working with bands, or even repeatedly lifting a can of beans or bottle of water. You only need to do strength training twice a week, then incorporate aerobic exercise such as walking, bike riding or swimming three times a week. [If you're just starting out do it] slowly, taking a walk to the corner and back. Each day add a little more. Why not try breaking it up—a walk one day, a bike ride the second day, and swimming the next. End your workout with a good stretching routine. It is just as important and shouldn't be forgotten.

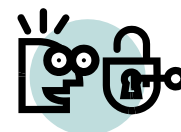

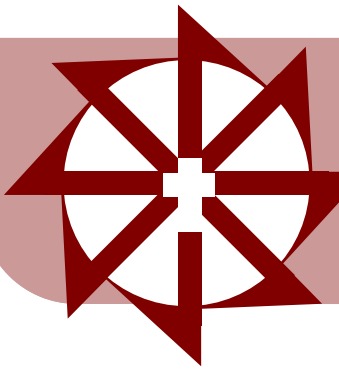

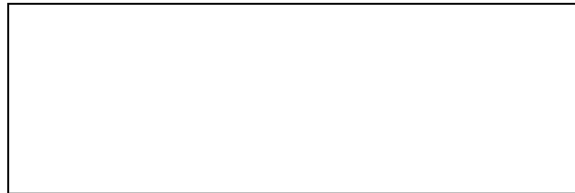

Beloved in Christ,

Lent begins with our observance of Ash Wednesday on February 17th. We invite everyone at St. Catherine's to enter fully into this season of repentance, reflection and prayer. As part of our parish Lenten observance, we are asking everyone at St. Catherine's prayerfully to open their hearts and minds to God's vision for St. Catherine's.

Just over ten years ago, St. Catherine's began the Emmaus Project. In a pastoral letter to the parish, Father Jim described the Emmaus Project as "a journey, as a parish family, to discern what God wants St. Catherine's to do and be in this place at this time in history". The Emmaus Project established a vision for our future based on prayer and feedback from the entire congregation. As a part of that process, we established a number of goals to help us measure our progress toward achieving that vision. Working together as a community, we have accomplished the majority of those goals. The Emmaus Project is bearing wonderful fruit in the life of this parish.

We will not be re-creating the Emmaus Project, but will stand on that firm foundation as we seek to begin the next phase of our life as a parish. We feel strongly that we should begin the next leg of our journey with prayer. Let us all ask God to reveal what opportunities and challenges are next for us in our life at St. Catherine's, and let us truly listen for God's reply. We have put down strong roots in the first fifty years of our life together. Now let us see how much more we can grow and blossom in the light of God's love and in the love we have for one another in this community.

During Lent we will take time for contemplation, for prayer, for cleansing and for preparing ourselves for the celebration of Easter. In the Easter season, we will celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord, and we will begin celebrating how far we have come and all that we have done together as a parish community. As the year progresses and we approach the celebration of St. Catherine's 50th Anniversary, we will begin to actively explore the next phase of our journey together. Please join us in daily prayer, asking God to prepare us, to give us a vision of our future, and to inspire us so that we may fearlessly and joyfully go where God leads us.
