Parish Prepares for 50TH ANNIVERSARY

The observance of St. Catherine's 50th anniversary promises to be a fun, educational, spiritual and memorable 13 months of activities and events for the entire parish. A committee has been established and will be working on three key areas: communications, special events and special projects. Planning is underway, a time line is being developed and, with this first of many articles to come, efforts to keep the parish informed have begun.

The year-long celebration will begin **Saturday, November 6, 2010** with a "Remembering the First 50" kick-off. Although details aren't yet been finalized, Marilyn Hunter, who chairs the special events committee, says the kick-off will most likely be an inter-generational event held in the afternoon. Working with her on the committee are Molly Frost, Joan Nixon and Bill Selby.

The anniversary observance will conclude with a Sunday celebration on **November 13, 2011.** Though tentative at this point, the plans are to host a birthday "gala" two days ear-

lier, on **Friday November 11, 2011.** "We like the idea of having a big party on 11-11-11," says Marilyn. St. Catherine's founding date is regarded as our first Holy Communion service held on December 4, 1961.

At the Quarterly Ministry Team meeting on June 1, team members brainstormed on the anniversary—discussing the purpose of the anniversary observance, possible themes and activities. "It was gratifying to get the input from this group," says Lisa Spessard, chairman of the communications committee. "There was plenty of enthusiasm, and the group offered really great ideas. Everyone was in general agreement that the anniversary year should be one of celebration, one in which everyone in the parish was involved. The goal during this time is to reflect on St. Catherine's rich history while also focusing on our future."

Vestry Notes

At the Vestry meeting on Tuesday, June 14, your Vestry:

- Learned from Tom Hunter the plans for the process which will be called The Journey to begin Sept. 19. This is a four step process – Inquiry, Formation in Christ, Preparing for Baptism and Reaffirmation, and Formation in Ministry. It is for those wishing to be baptized, confirmed, renewing vows as well as those who wish to gain a deeper understanding of the sacraments and what it means to be a member of the corporate life of the church.
- Heard a report from Barbara Garner, Ana Martin, and Allison Harris. They presented the status of our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd formation program as well as their short and long term goals. We learned that St. Catherine's is a regional center for the training of catechists' formation, are serving in a nation-wide leadership role, and one of only two parishes in Atlanta having all three atriums. The need for additional space to adequately serve these children and their catechists is critical.

- Approved a 2010 diocesan pledge of \$66,269.
- Received update on the Search Committee on progress in the search for a Youth Director. The goal is to have our new director in place by September.
- Agreed to meet July 20 to discuss long term planning and begin to identify members of the Holy Conversations team to serve with Stephanie Yucius.
- Welcomed Robbie Roy, Tanya Bowers-Dean, Dani Dickson, and Susan Jablonski's offer to design our banner for Ministry Fair.
- Approved a video presentation as part of your Vestry's contribution to the 50th anniversary.
- Received financial report from Tom Blackstock. We are on track for the year but it is so important that you keep your pledge current during the summer months. May income was less than budgeted and expenses more than expected.
- Received pre-school financials and approved the setting up of temporary restricted accounts to be for our special projects and activities during the 50th anniversary celebrations.

THE JOURNEY

On Pentecost Sunday (May 23) we were joined by Bishop Whitmore as we celebrated the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit. Every member of Christ's body is a recipient of those gifts. The gifts are given to you and to me in very personal and particular ways. Your gift(s) may be different than my gift(s), but all of these gifts share something in common. They are given to us by God, not to hold to ourselves, like some warm and fuzzy experience. They are given to us to empower us for ministry, so that we might give ourselves away in loving service to others as we have been loved by God. The amazing thing that I have discovered in my own giving of myself in service to others is that the more I give of myself, the more I receive in return, pressed down and running over.

I invite you to consider a new program we are offering at St. Catherine's as a way for you to share your gifts with others. It's called THE JOURNEY, our catechumenal process. The catechumenate is a journey in faith designed for those seeking baptism and those seeking to reaffirm their baptismal vows through confirmation, reception or reaffirmation. THE JOURNEY is open to all people, baptized and unbaptized, who want to enter a process of exploration and growth in their faith.

Each of the participants in THE JOURNEY will receive a sponsor. Their sponsor will be a member of St. Catherine's who will befriend, guide and support their participant as they accompany them in the catechumenal process. In addition to Amma Susan and Father Jim there will be several lay catechists (teachers) needed to lead the small groups.

I ask your prayers for the success of St. Catherine's catechumenal process and that God will provide the teachers and sponsors to accompany the participants in THE JOURNEY. I trust that God has poured out the gifts needed to empower us for this ministry. Please prayerfully consider giving of yourself as a teacher or sponsor. THE JOURNEY will take time and commitment, but the blessings of sharing your faith journey with another person's journey will be profound and beyond number.

Environmental Stewardship

My working career began before Earth Day and included responsibility for negotiating new permits and for managing water quality, air quality, and solid waste requirements for a major pulp and paper manufacturer. This didn't happen for free. There were new jobs, new technologies, new investment costs and additional expenses to pay these people and operate this equipment. There were relatively local improvements to the environment: rivers and lakes became fishable and swimmable, the air we breathe and its impact on our health got better, with more recycling small improvements in energy efficiency occurred.

Near the end of my working career, the buzz word became sustainability. Although prior wisdom held that death, taxes and change were the only constants, we were now urged to seek technologies that were sustainable. God gave us this world and its resources to use as we see fit. Conservation and care must be part of this approach. It is not unlimited.

Today the environmental hot button is global warming. The world population is

6 billion and is projected to become 12 billion in the next forty years. This is not a local situation, and the debate about what to do has mind-boggling alternatives with mind boggling costs which may or may not solve the most important problems. If the sea level increases some, it should occur slowly enough for folks to move or take remedial action. However, if there isn't enough food, it becomes an immediate. life threatening issue to anyone without enough. Perhaps higher temperatures are being provided to lengthen the growing season. Perhaps carbon dioxide is increasing because that will improve crop yield. The biggest environmental issue we must solve is the care of these 6 billion new neighbors.

I'm sure we're all dismayed by the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico as well as by the loss of 29 miners in the coal mine explosion a few weeks ago. I hope everyone who drives a car or runs an air conditioner wonders about their complicity for what has and continues to happen. What can we do? Every day we have an opportunity to plan our travel to drive fewer miles. Every day we make decisions about the temperature we set our heating and A/C units, how much hot water we use, turning off lights that are not needed, and on and on.... We also have the opportunity to influence and help those around us.

EFM— is it for you?

What do Jesus, Richard Petty, and Elvis have in common? I know that many of you readers probably lay awake nights thinking... if only I could studying the Bible and learn about theological reflection. Or maybe not.... I imagine that some of you think that EFM is an egghead pursuit requiring a ton of study and serious thought. Think again.

EFM, Education for Ministry, is a program from the University of the South. There is a set of weekly reading (approximately 20 pages a week). Each student reads that lesson and it is discussed in a group (so you have plenty of chances to argue, affirm, decry, whatever, about what you read that week). You sign up for one year at a time (total of 4 years) and there is a cost. We have limited scholarship money to pay part for those in need. First year students study the Old Testament, second years study the New Testament, third years study church history, and fourth years study church phi-

losophy. We spend about half of our time talking about what we've read and learned. We connect the dots using all four pieces of information to help us figure out where we are today and where we might be going.

The second half of our time is devoted to a "theological reflection." It is a way of looking at everything theologically. People in the class can bring in anything—a picture, a story, an article, a thing, or an idea. Rarely is it a religious item. Usually it is not. We take that everyday thing and we compare from our own experience, our culture, and our religion. We help each other hash out—in a loving and genuine community—just what matters and what we really believe.

What about Jesus, Richard Petty, and Elvis? We covered that last year but I'm sure something equally as interesting will surface when YOU join us. 
