I know that many of you have noticed the distinct silver Greek cross worn by various women at St. Catherine's. The bearers of these crosses are members of Daughters of the King, a lay order for women of the Episcopal Church. Every Daughter pledges herself to a lifelong vow of prayer and service dedicated to the extension of Christ's Kingdom and to the strengthening of the spiritual life of her parish. At St. Catherine's, the Daughters' Chapter meets once a month to renew ourselves with a short meditation or study, then we share prayer requests for ourselves, our families, our friends, and other members of the congregation. Our meetings are open to all women of the church, and we welcome anyone who is interested to join us on the second Wednesday night of each month at 6:30 PM. We plan to start a new training class in the fall for those interested in joining us.

In addition to our ministry of prayer, we have a few other on-

going projects. These include providing baptismal banners of all being baptized (Julie Brannock is in charge of this). We also have a prayer shawl ministry for church members in need. We provide supper twice a year at Elizabeth Inn and have made rosaries for youth pilgrimages and members of the Journey. The Daughters of the King also sponsors Quiet Days (or Nights) of prayer which are open to the whole parish.

Our hope for our chapter is not to do more, for we are all active in many, various ministries in the church already, but rather our goal is to support each other in fellowship and prayer to enable us to continue doing our chosen ministries. I think I can speak for all the Daughters in our Chapter that I find D.O.K. to be a safe place in a busy world where I can be together with like-minded Christian women and feel supported through the love of Christ.

This month as part of our 50th Anniversary Year of Celebration we celebrate the life and work of our vestry. Your vestry sponsored a Day of Community Service.

On Saturday, May 7th, 45 St. Catherine's parishioners descended on the MUST Ministries Warehouse to help with sorting and organizing tons of food and clothing donations. The primary participants were our Confirmation Candidates from both J2A and *The Journey* classes, as well as the candidates' sponsors, vestry members and our clergy.

Choosing to work with MUST Ministries was the natural choice as it highlights and complements St. Catherine's established and ongoing volunteer activities with MUST Ministries including:

- Providing dinners on the 28th of each month and doing laundry **for over 25 years:**
- Preparing hundreds of bag lunches for the MUST Summer Lunch Program;
- Providing monthly breakfasts;
- Gathering food, school supplies and other needed donations throughout the year;
- Sharing our Rector, Father Jim, who sits on the MUST Board of Directors

They were also able to accommodate our exceptionally large group of volunteers!

What a privilege it was to join together with fellow parishioners and spend a few hours

sorting and organizing essential food and clothing for our neighbors. The energy and the interest from the Confirmation Candidates and their sponsors almost overwhelmed us. As a matter of fact, it was so much fun that we plan to hold another day of service at the MUST Ministries Warehouse in the fall. This will allow us to invite the entire parish community to join us! Look for the date coming soon.

In the last year, MUST Ministries served our neighbors in need by:

- Serving 78,617 meals at the Loaves and Fishes Kitchen
- Giving away more than a ton of food a day
- Clothing almost 10,000 people by giving away 160,709 items of clothing
- Providing shelter with 46,741 safe nights of rest at the Elizabeth Inn Shelter and in permanent and supportive housing
- Feeding 106,000 summer lunches to children in need
- Giving toys and gifts to 4,000 children at Christmas and New school supplies to 2,500 children
- Caring for neighbors with more than 2,000 patient contacts through the KSU Community Health Clinic at MUST
- Helping more than 400 people find jobs in our education and employment programs

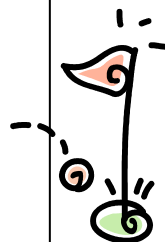
Youth Mentors Hike

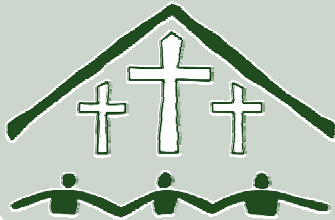
Praying for Pars
