50th Anniversary Brickwalk

Be a part of our legacy and help celebrate our 50th anniversary! The Parish Administration and Facilities Ministry Team has undertaken replacing the asphalt under the Great Oak Tree with a brick walkway as the team's 50th Anniversary ministry focus. The bricks will be installed in an attractive design of approximately 250 laser-engraved 8" x 8" dark red bricks, surrounded by plain 4"x 8" sand color pavers. Sample bricks are on view in the church foyer.

You are invited to purchase one or more bricks engraved with your message of up to four lines (18 characters per line including spaces), such as family names, to honor a friend, a ministry, or as a memorial to a loved one. Cost is \$50 per brick (includes engraving, shipping & installation). A tax deductible contribution of \$30 may be taken for each.

Did you know this about your outreach?

Our Holy Conversations team is listening a lot these days and what they are hearing is very positive about our life together. There are many themes to the data but one that we are hearing loud and clear is our deepest desire to serve one another and our community. Certainly we will be bringing forth a goal or goals that speak to this desire.

So how are you doing as of right now? Well, here are some observations:

- The first Day of Service sponsored by the Vestry in May brought out 45 people to work two shifts at the MUST Ministries Donation Center. Over two shifts (morning and afternoon) you sorted clothes, sorted food, and packed food. You shared lunch together and made a name for yourselves in the amount of work you accomplished.
- You joined the Covenant Churches of East Cobb to design and prepare for a Habitat-like build of a new building on MUST's Elizabeth Inn campus. You have contributed \$13,000 to that build and are now preparing for the sweat equity investment required to make it a reality.
- You have together served 5 dinners at MUST, 5 breakfasts and done laundry. You have contributed to making a bad situation a little better for those who depend on Elizabeth Inn for emergency shelter.
- You have mentored students in our own congregation, at East Cobb Middle School and through the Communities in Schools program led by our very own Carol Fey.
- You have collected and delivered day-old bread each month from Publix and other stores in our area.
- You have collected and distributed nearly \$22,000 in special offerings to support The Extension, MUST Ministries, Episcopal Relief and Development, financial relief for

Visiting Clergy for 50th Anniversary

A part of our 50th Anniversary celebration is to invite former clergy of St. Catherine's to join us this summer



and fall to preach and celebrate with us. We are also inviting them to our Gala Celebration on Friday, November 11.

To date the **Rev. Jim Clarke** has accepted our invitation and will be with us August 7 and the **Rev. David Wayland** will be with us November 6. Both Jim and David will also be with us November 11. We thought you'd like a bit of history concerning both of them.

In 1962, the present land of approximately 10 acres was acquired for a four-phase building program at a cost of \$12,500. By 1967, St. Catherine's had grown to 95 communicants and the Rev. James Clarke was appointed as a part-time vicar. Construction of the second sanctuary was begun in 1968. The first service was held in March, 1970 and Father Clarke became the full time vicar.

The Rev. David F. Wayland came to us from Covington, Kentucky in May, 1977. Our tradition of holding hands at the Lord's Prayer came from Fr. David. Stephen Ministers, a lay ministry group who are trained to minister to folks in need of pastoral care as suggested by the rector came about this time. Under Fr. David's leadership the Vestry on September 6, 1980, after a retreat for discussions and prayer, advised the Bishop that we would stay on Holt Road. Our theme and slogan became "Bloom Where You Are Planted." Father Wayland left in January 1988 to go back to his family homestead and take care of his apple orchard, and became the priest at two small Episcopal Churches in Virginia.

We hope you will be with us both on August 7 and November 6 to greet Fr. Jim and Fr. David and to thank them for the foundations they each help lay that allows us to be the people of God we are today.

Do you have eyeglasses, contact lenses, hearing aids that you no longer use? You can make a difference in someone's life just by putting those items in the Lions collection box now in the church foyer. They will be sorted and delivered to the Lions' Lighthouse for the Blind in Decatur, where they will be examined and classified, repaired and refurbished as needed. They will then be distributed at no cost to those who need them, particularly in developing countries. And you will have brought the gift of sight to someone.

The East Cobb Lions Club, who provided the collection box and will deliver glasses and hearing aids to the Lighthouse, is an affiliate of Lions Clubs International, the largest service organization in the world with 1.35 million members in 206 countries. Particular emphasis, though not all, is on aiding those with sight problems. Our local Lions Club provides vision screening, eye exams and eyeglasses in Cobb County; the Lions Lighthouse provides those services as well as eye surgery and hearing aids to uninsured and low-income Georgians throughout the state; Lions International carries on humanitarian work all over the world. These and other projects are supported by local fundraising, and all funds generated go to projects and programs; operating expenses are all paid for by club dues. The Lions motto is "We Serve." You can help us by putting your used eyeglasses, eyeglass parts, and hearing aids, no matter what their condition, in the blue and white box.

The Journey

St. Catherine's has just completed the first year of *The Journey*, our process that prepares adults for baptism, confirmation, reception or reaffirmation of their baptismal vows. The Journey has provided a safe place where people hungering to know God and seeking a church home were able to explore their faith in community with members of St. Catherine's, catechists and sponsors who shared that faith journey with them. This has been a marvelous experience and has borne wonderful fruit. We have studied and prayed together, laughed and cried together, and formed community and new members of Christ's body together. Two adults were baptized at The Great Vigil of Easter and fifteen adults were presented to the Bishop for confirmation on June 5.

The success of The Journey lies in its lay leaders, who have a very special voice that needs to be heard every bit as much as, and sometimes more than, the one coming from the person wearing a clergy collar. Following this article are a few comments made by this year's catechists about their experience of The Journey.

We are now recruiting people to serve as catechists (teachers and small group leaders) for The Journey, meeting on Wednesday evenings in the next school year. If you are a good listener and can maintain confidentiality, if you enjoy working with groups of

adults and are a team player, and if you can speak about your faith journey while accepting others where they are in their faith journey, then you have the gifts needed to be a catechist. When I was first asked to be a catechist for *The Journey*, I didn't have a clue. When I then found out that a catechist was a teacher and The Journey was an in-depth course to prepare people for Baptism, Confirmation and Reception into the Episcopal Church, my confusion turned to apprehension. I certainly didn't feel qualified. But I agreed anyway. (Amma Susan can be very convincing.) I soon found that my role was actually more that of a facilitator and a fellow pilgrim on the path to deeper faith. I learned a lot from the discussions on the Bible and the Church and on the sacraments spiritual disciplines, but even greater were the deep lessons I learned from the enthusiasm of new Christians and the life wisdom of those who were in the process of changing their lives. I clearly saw God at work in our lives and my own faith grew as a result. If you want new friends, greater knowledge and a deeper faith, I highly recommend The Journey.

I Said Yes

This brief note is about a decision I made two years ago to say 'yes, thank you,' when it seemed perhaps wiser to say 'no, thank you.' Amelia Arthur (our Youth Director before Mike Peterson joined us) asked me to become a leader for the Rite-13 group of our Journey to Adulthood (J2A) youth program. The J2A program is very impressive, powerful, and meaningful. I believe in it. I believe that it can improve some of the things that are awry in our culture.

I gave Amelia a hesitant 'yes, thank you.' Hesitant because of my commitment to other passions and priorities. But if Sue believed I could re-prioritize for two school years, so did I. I was also hesitant because of my lacking theological qualifications and Biblical knowledge. But I'm a good listener. I draw and write easily. I wonder a lot. I'm in awe a lot. And, I seek out opportunities to learn new things about myself and my relationship to God. I'm not fearless, but in that small way, I feel like I'm brave.

Rite-13 is comprised of 7th and 8th graders, roughly 12 to 15 years old. It is an age I had not been around since middle school. Would they listen? Would they be able to sit still? Would they share their thoughts? Would I get beat up after school? I remember a prayer I wrote at the beginning of the class, for God to help me to be trusting in my intentional presence, to help me overcome my anxiety and fears about leading discussions about prayer, about God, about our selves and our strengths and weaknesses. I didn't mind not knowing all the answers, but hoped God could help me not feel like throwing up before each class.

It all worked out. It always seems to, if I'm not particular. Our Rite-13 class consisted of about fifteen very regular attendees who were involved, companionable, fun, silly, thoughtful, and caring. We shared the ups and downs of our week. We made our room into our own unique spiritual place. We grew to trust and respect each other. We were sometimes too loud, too energetic, too interrupting, too messy, too distracted. Sometimes we discussed what we'd hoped. We discussed the many types of prayer; Millennium Development Goals; social, health, and economic issues in the world; how we see God; how we relate to both relatives and peers; what book reports still need to be finished; what we wore to the dance; where we're going for summer vacation; who we are and how God sees us.

- Have a personal desire to serve in this position

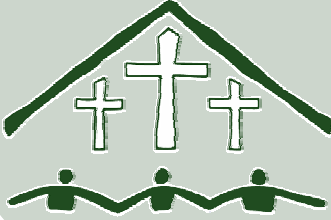

Listening sessions will allow the committee to learn what Episcopalians—laypeople, priests and deacons—have to say about the diocese. The sessions will seek discussion and responses to some general questions including: What is going well in the Diocese of Atlanta? What are the challenges in the Diocese of Atlanta? What are the characteristics you seek in our next bishop? How do you see the spiritual nature of the diocese changing? What kind of diocese do we need to become?
