Get out your party clothes and put a shine on your dancing shoes because St. Catherine's is having a celebration, the likes of which only happens every fifty years. Our 50th Anniversary Gala will be Friday, November 11, at The Pavillion of East Cobb at 736 Johnson Ferry Road, Marietta (in Fountains of Olde Towne plaza), beginning at 6:30 p.m. Invitations have been mailed, so if you didn't get one call the church office right away. Reservation deadline is October 2, and payment is required—the cost is \$25 per person—at the time the reservations are made. Walk-ups are not permitted, and attendance is limited to just over 200 guests. For this reason, you'll want to make your reservations as quickly as possible.

Marilyn Hunter, Ginny Lummus, Lisa Spesard and members of the 50th Anniversary committees have planned what promises to

be a memorable and joyous evening of dining, dancing and fellowship. Special guests include Frank T. Griswold, 25th Presiding Bishop, Retired, the evening's speaker; our own bishop, J. Neil Alexander; and past clergy of St. Catherine's (from whom we are waiting to hear).

Dinner will be served at three progressive buffet stations, including a Carving Station, a New South Station and a Gourmet Station. A variety of non-alcoholic beverages will be provided throughout the evening, and alcoholic beverages will be available at a cash bar. Guests will toast the past and future of St. Catherine's with champagne.

Throughout the evening, *The Grapevine*, a 10-piece band from Macon, Georgia will provide music for entertainment and dancing. The band specializes in music from the late 60s to the early 80s. About the band, the word on the street: "They are fabulous!" The Gala will end at 10:30 p.m. We'll see you there!

Joan retires

Joan retires from WellStar Health Systems on October 14. She retires from health care after 42 years. She has spent the last 13 of those years at WellStar. I want to beg your patience as I honor her commitment in this space.

I honor her because for 42 years she has focused on one thing in her career—the patient in the bed in a hospital. She did this, of course, in her early years as a unit nurse but later in a variety of administrative roles. On her most frustrating days I would say to her—why not do something else? Her answer was always the same. Leaving her vocation, she believed, compromised the quality of health care she so believed people wanted and deserved when they entered the hospital environment and for which she devoted long hours every day. When she wasn't directly involved in delivering high quality care in a hospital environment I could see she was not happy. I kid about what people should do if they see Joan approaching with a needle after all

these years away from the bedside, but the honest truth is that you could not be approached by a more caring and conscientious nurse.

I honor her because for 40 of these 42 years she has willingly and joyfully put her career in a secondary position as she's followed me around first with Procter and Gamble and then with the church. And she has never complained even when dealt some very strange hands in the job game. She has always had time to encourage me and to comfort me when I needed it most. I can only hope in the end I have done the same for her.

So October 14 will come and it will go and Joan will have the time to do what she wants when she wants to do it. Praise God! But the health care industry will lose someone who for 42 years has never forgotten why she became a nurse and why she has labored so many long hours – the person in the bed, sick and ailing, and longing to know they will receive the highest quality care.



Sept. 16 — With persistent effort by a number of people, we have gotten the Grading permit and the Foundation permit! Fred Massey will arrange for the foundation work to begin as soon as possible; hopefully early next week. At the same time we will continue to pursue the Building permit.

Please check your work schedule to recalculate where we are... We continue to make progress!! Keep Praying.



Sept. 20 — Dear God, now that we have our foundation permit we could really use some clear weather as we need to pour our footings this Thursday and then pour our walls either Saturday or early next week. We will need to dig out the center after that and nice weather would help make that job easier. Once we dig out inside the foundation we can pour our 10 piers that will hold the two floor beams. We will need a team to seal the foundation-water proof, so we'll need good weather then and also when we install the posts and beam. Once the beam is in place and the outside is water sealed we could use clear weather again to install our floor system on Saturday October the 8th. (And yes, that weekend is a TECH home game and I know it never rains on a Tech home game but I thought I'd ask just to be safe)...

On Stewardship

Stewardship is not easy for me although it was at one time. My parents raised me to give and eventually to pledge my allowance. My home church had neat little envelopes. Each Saturday night, at my parents guiding, I would put my quarters in the envelope and then use my pencil to place check marks on the appropriate boxes on the front before sealing the flap. On Sunday morning I would then participate in the ritual of placing my envelope and passing the plate myself. Proud and happy to be part of the church.

Every year we would fill in a pledge card and walk it down the center aisle and place it in a little replica of our church that sat in front of the altar. As a child it was exciting to be a part of this process. The best part came a month later when we received the new envelopes. I'd have a whole box of envelopes and each envelope would have my name on the front and the date on top. It was fun to receive these each year and work through the box throughout the year, watching it slowly empty. I have good memories of giving as a child.

Somewhere along the way stewardship stopped being fun and became difficult. Somewhere along the way the envelopes began to take on a different meaning. Somewhere along the way the quarters turned into checks. That 'somewhere' coincided with my first mortgage, first car and first child. Stewardship became a bill to pay, an item to budget and debit to schedule. Even if I still had the little envelopes it was not fun anymore. The priorities of home and family were overwhelming at times and required me to make sacrifices. Stewardship was one of the sacrifices. Rationalization came easy as I compared the relative needs of my family and church. Somewhere along the way I forgot about faith.

The unquestioning faith I had as a child as I walked down the aisle with my pledge card,

trusting that what I was doing was right and was good, got lost on my way to adulthood. The faith I had as a child was based largely in a belief that what my parents did was good and right. I was emulating them and knew that what I was doing was good and right. As I matured I developed my own ideas of what is good and what is right. Many of my ideas, rightly so, were about how to best provide for my family. These ideas required little faith. The connection between my income and my family was obvious, unlike placing a check in an offering plate. Providing for my family and home are things I could do and they were good things. The envelopes were all too often left in their box. Stewardship and faith were left behind. What I was missing was that it was never about what was in the envelope, it was about the faith required to seal that envelope, carry it each Sunday and drop it in the plate. Letting it go, having faith.

Each Sunday as we pass the plate and it weaves its way around the pews, our hands carrying it, we are all participating in an act of faith. For each of us, stewardship is a deeply personal decision. It is a decision that leads to an act of faith that we all share in each Sunday. It takes stewardship off of the kitchen table or desk where we struggle with the day to day challenges of finances and connects it with the community of faith. No longer is it about how I will better control my spending or plan my retirement. It is about joining with this community of believers knowing that what we do together is good and right. It has been this act of faith that has brought me back to the joy of stewardship. I am blessed to be in such a wonderful community as St. Catherine's with so many good reasons to give. Our impact on the community and world are things to be proud of as a parish. Another reason for stewardship is that it gives me a way to truly, simply, participate with others, in a joyous act of faith.
