Waiting and Preparing

Advent is the season that begins the new year in the church calendar. For four weeks, November 27 through Christmas Eve, the dominant themes of this season are waiting and preparing; waiting and preparing for the second coming of Christ as judge in great majesty and glory even as we look forward to celebrating the first coming of Christ as our savior as a lowly infant at Christmas.

I don't know about you, but preparing is a lot easier for me than waiting. Just as we prepare our homes for the coming of a guest, giving it a good deep cleaning and an extra shine on the furniture, so too our hearts need to be prepared to be places where such a mighty guest may come and make His home. That takes some spiritual housecleaning and that's where the waiting comes in. In this day and time, waiting isn't something for which we are conditioned. We are accustomed to having what we want instantly: we prefer e-mail to snail-mail, microwave ovens make dinner appear almost instantaneously, newspapers struggle to survive as television and the web

allow us to see news as it is happening. We are not conditioned for waiting but getting our hearts ready for Christ's coming takes some very intentional waiting time. It means stepping back from the frenzied pace of the culture around us that has had Christmas decorations and muzak proclaiming that Christmas is upon us since before Halloween. It means allowing ourselves to remain in the open posture of waiting. Waiting gives our hearts the time they need to become receptive homes prepared for the Coming One.

I lift up to you four offerings to help with your waiting and preparing. On Nov. 27th during the church school hour, you will have the opportunity to **make an Advent wreath**. During Advent, the lighting of each candle, along with the reading of Holy Scripture and prayer help us to wait and prepare.

On December 2nd, from 7-9 PM, come to the **Parish Quiet Evening**. The theme of the evening is Waiting in The Darkness. There will be a meditation followed by time for reflection, body prayer, walking the labyrinth, and a Taize service. Childcare will be

offered (by advance reservation).

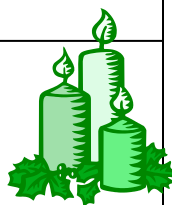

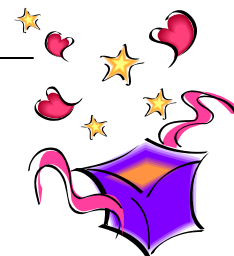

On Pledging

Nearly ten years ago, life was in a nice flow. Good job, comfortable life, secure future. Pledging was a part of it, the right thing to do. I know now that I pledged an amount I knew I could honor, but not a reach. Then, my life changed—radically. For the first time ever, no part of it was comfortable. I still pledged for a few more years, then gradually reduced the amount, then just kind of drifted away from the commitment.

Last year I made a conscious decision not to pledge at all. Realistically, why would I

pledge? I was unemployed, each day a struggle. Since I had nothing to offer or contribute that would make any difference, I decided to just leave it. Then, my epiphany. *It's not about the amount.* That part doesn't matter. It's about just doing it. It doesn't matter if it's \$2.00. The only part that matters is my personal commitment.

End of story: I pledged an incredibly small amount of money. I trusted that even that small amount would be there. To date, I've kept my pledge and guess what? I'm ahead of my committed teensy amount. I have one area in my life I absolutely know I can do. It's not about how much. It's the freedom and strength that came to me when I chose.

Diocesan Council

Annual Council of the Diocese of Atlanta made it clear that our diocese is alive and well. Three themes dominated this year's council, 1) our people's passion for the mission of this church, reaching out in shared ministry through the Church of the Common Ground, our companion dioceses and in Tanzania; 2) the passion for social justice—the resolutions concerning the impact of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement act of 2011, a halt to the death penalty and the resolution opposing human trafficking; and 3) our call to love our neighbor in the constitutional change to allow campus ministry student representation at council and in the resolutions passed on suicide prevention, parental leave for the birth or adoption of a child, and the Nets for Life ministry.

Sitting on a cold metal chair, shuffling papers, listening to reports on diocesan finances, audit practices, and budget reports can make one wonder why we volunteer to go. Reminiscent of past councils, this year's had talk of indulgences, fools, and Pelagius. Pelagius did not get a reprieve from his status as a heretic of the 400's. Strangely there was more heated discussion about him than there was about opposing the death penalty or Georgia's immigration law.

There was even an "altar call" to provide funding for the Church of the Common Ground. Many of us found it disturbing as delegates lined up to make pledges for their congregations. We felt we did not have that authority and we agreed with the Chair of the Diocesan Budget Committee that

"heroic giving is no way to fund an ongoing ministry." We will try to help through our own Outreach budget.

Then, things picked up. There was a report from a missionary to Tanzania and the Rev. Claiborne Jones spoke about the wonderful work continuing at Emmaus House. There was a presentation of the fabulous summer programs at Camp Mikel and improvements to those facilities, we learned about the NETS initiative (you can save lives in Africa with only a \$12.00 donation for a mosquito net), and finally, we were all moved by a teen (absolutely terrified to speak to all of us old people) who spoke about the impact Kids4Peace has made in her life and all the youth in our diocese (including our own Katie Barrington) who have participated, and the youth from Jerusalem and Palestine who got to know each other through this initiative sponsored through our diocese.

The undercurrent was the knowledge that this was the last annual council over which Bishop Alexander will preside. The Bishop made it clear that he does not see the diocesan train slowing down in the waning months of his days in office, and he asked that no special emphasis be put on the remaining days. However, in the response to the Bishops' address, the council took the opportunity to express through our applause our appreciation.

For many reasons, we saw how very important it is for us at St. Catherine's to be a part of the "big picture"; how we can participate in these larger ministries that we cannot do on our own, how hard working and dedicated our diocesan staff is, and what a wonderful thing it is to be part of the Anglican Communion and the Diocese of Atlanta.

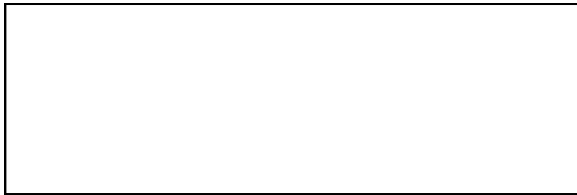
