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You might have noticed that the printed *Wheel* newsletter is arriving at your home later these days. We mail *The Wheel* at non-profit bulk rate and its delivery has slowed down noticeably over the past six months. We have worked with the USPS and seen relief in some zip codes but not all. For this reason and more, we are moving ahead to improve our communication with you.

We are converting all of our newsletters to email/online only effective February 1. We will continue to send a weekly parish email as we have been doing for some time now. We recognize that some do not have the technology or the desire to receive *The Wheel* electronically. For you we will have print copies of *The Wheel* available for pickup at church, and will have access for those who cannot pick up their copy in person.

Going forward, we are investigating the use of an e-news software—similar to what the Diocese of Atlanta uses—which will allow us to include more color and photographs, access more in-depth articles, and improve the “curb appeal” of our weekly email. We hope that by the end of the first quarter we will have all our news in a weekly document you receive via email.

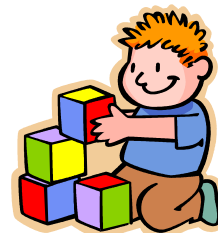

Adult program in Epiphany: "Holy Women and Holy Men"

Epiphany is a time for rededicating ourselves to our own ministries and our missionary task - to continue the spread of Jesus' light in the world. It is also a time to celebrate all those who through their lives have modeled for us discipleship. During Epiphany we will look at five individuals as their lives and ministries are remembered through *Holy Women and Holy Men*. Fully revised and expanded, this new work is the official revision of *Lesser Feasts and Fasts* and authorized for trial use by the 2009 General Convention.

Coming in Lent: "Screwtape Letters"

Join our adult program in Lent on C. S. Lewis's *The Screwtape Letters*. In his

book, C.S. Lewis provides a series of lessons in the importance of taking a deliberate role in living out Christian faith by portraying a typical human life, with all its temptations and failings, as seen from the devils' viewpoints. *Screwtape* holds an administrative post in the bureaucracy of Hell, and acts as a mentor to Wormwood, the inexperienced tempter. In the body of the thirty-one letters which make up the book, *Screwtape* gives Wormwood detailed advice on various methods of undermining faith and promoting sin in the Patient, interspersed with observations on human nature and Christian doctrine. Wormwood and *Screwtape* live in a peculiarly morally reversed world, where individual benefit and greed are seen as the greatest good, and neither demon is capable of comprehending or acknowledging true human virtue when he sees it.

The book is readily available in the public library and for purchase at bookstores and online sources. A syllabus will be published by the middle of February.

We will meet each Wednesday beginning February 29 in the Conference Room in the office area of the church from 6:30 to 7:30 pm. Everyone is invited. Child care will be provided. You are invited to come for dinner starting at 5:45 pm. Following our study each week we will gather in the sanctuary for prayer with music provided by Mike Peterson (Youth Director) and a group of our youth.

Dear Partners in Serving your Neighbors in Need,

As we begin the New Year at MUST Ministries, we reflect on the past and count our blessing. One of our most cherished blessings is having tremendous support from the faith-based community in all the counties where we have a presence. Each of you has stood side by side with us during 2011 by supporting MUST Ministries with your Prayers, Volunteers and Finances.

The economic climate and unemployment in 2011 has not subsided, which pushed more of your struggling neighbors to seek the services provided by MUST Ministries. In 2011 we served more clients than ever with groceries, hot meals, clothing, emergency shelter, other housing programs, educational support and job assistance. We expanded our Cherokee and Cobb Summer Lunch for children on free or reduced school lunches into North Fulton, Gwinnett and Paulding counties where we served more than 141,000 meals in five counties. Our MUST "Toy Shop" helped more than 4,500 children have a Merry Christmas. We found 335 individuals employment and the KSU Wellstar School of Nursing Community Health Clinic on one of our campuses saw 1,900 patients.

None of the above achievements would have been possible without the most amazing statistic of them all.....more than 6,000 volunteers donated 255,482 hours of service and talents to MUST Ministries. On behalf of the 34,000 people we served last year, thank you to your church and congregation for all you have done and continue to do for the clients of MUST Ministries. Sunday, January 22 we will install eight new members of St. Catherine's Chapter of Daughters of the King. These D.I.T.S. (Daughters in Training) as they have been affectionately known to us for these last several months, have just finished a training session led by Elaine Krupp and Ann Snead. The preparation to become a Daughter is a 12-lesson study designed to introduce them to the rules of prayer and service, as well as a background and history of the Order. When we install these eight new members it will bring our present membership to 35. We welcome Deana DeLaBarre, Marcia Markette, Jodi Gammon, Barbara Perry, Natalie Whitlow, Shirley Day, Nancy Certain and Katja Michael.

The Daughters of the King is a religious order of women in Episcopal and Roman Catholic churches. Members take a public vow of prayer and service to support the church and clergy in many different ways. Installed at St. Catherine's in 1999, we recently celebrated our 12th year as a chapter. We meet once a month to renew ourselves with a short meditation or study, and then we share prayer requests for ourselves, our families, our friends, and other members of the congregation. Our meetings are open to all women of the church, and we welcome

anyone who is interested to join us on the second Wednesday night of each month at 6:30 PM.

In addition to our ministry of prayer, we have a few other ongoing projects. These include providing baptismal banners of all being baptized (Julie Brannock is in charge of this). We have been placing blue colored prayer cards in the pews as a complement to the church's prayer chain and as an outreach of our vow of prayers. We offer confidential prayer for those who desire it. We also have a prayer shawl ministry for church members and friends in need. We provide supper twice a year at Elizabeth Inn and have made Anglican rosaries for youth pilgrims and members of the Journey. The Daughters of the King also sponsors Quiet Days (or Nights) of prayer which are open to the whole parish.

Our hope for our chapter is not to do more, for we are all active in many, various ministries in the church already, but rather our goal is to support each other in fellowship and prayer to enable us to continue doing our chosen ministries. I think I can speak for all the Daughters in our Chapter that I find D.O.K. to be a safe place in a busy world where I can be together with like-minded Christian women and feel supported through the love of Christ.
