Holy Week and Our Preparation for Easter

➤ Palm Sunday Readers

The Alleluia Fund

This weekend you will begin to find in your bulletin and during the coming weeks in other communications information concerning the Alleluia Fund for Mission. The fund is an annual giving opportunity for every Episcopalian during the Great Fifty Days of Easter. At this year's Annual Council, the Congregational Growth and Development commission submitted the following resolution and it passed Council unanimously:

Be it resolved that the Diocese of Atlanta implement the Alleluia Fund for Mission in order to fulfill an important goal of the 2003 Strategic Plan to establish seven new congregations by the end of this decade and to commit to the renewal and growth of the Episcopal Church in Middle and North Georgia.

You will see a more complete article on the Alleluia Fund elsewhere in this Wheel.

Briefly, the Alleluia Fund for Mission (AFM) is an essential step toward the goal of creating a climate in this Diocese that will joyfully support future growth. The AFM will provide every Episcopalian in this Diocese with an annual opportunity, primarily during the Easter season, to support the establishment of new congregations in this diocese.

Over the next few weeks and throughout the Great Fifty Days of Easter you will hear more about this opportunity to give to the great commission in the Diocese of Atlanta in middle and north Georgia. I strongly urge you to read the material you will receive and to prayerfully consider a gift to this work no matter how large or small it may be.

that **all** people **can** avail themselves of this sacrament, **some should**, but **none must**. If you want to explore this sacrament including simply inquiring about it, please contact either Fr. Jim or Sherry for an appointment during Holy Week. *Confessions are not restricted to times of sickness. They may be heard anytime and anywhere.*

➤ Prayer Vigil

Then he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, So, could you not stay awake with me one hour? Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak. MATT. 26:40-41

Our custom is to keep Vigil with our Lord through the night from immediately following the Maundy Thursday liturgy until Morning Prayer on Good Friday at 9:00 AM. The sign up poster will be on the glass wall in the Narthex. Please stop by and find a half-hour or hour period of time you can sit in prayer with Christ in his passion in the garden at Gethesemane. We will have security in the building through the night. Won't you spend one hour with your Lord?

➤ Security for our Prayer Vigil

Our custom for the Prayer Vigil is to provide security— someone to be at the church during the night, so parishioners coming to pray are not alone. The evening is divided into 3 watches: 9:30pm-12:30am; 12:30am-3:30am; 3:30am-6:30am. Diocese Centennial Celebration

The first Trustees of Georgia on November 8, 1732, established the first Anglican church in Georgia, ordering Oglethorpe to "set out three hundred acres of Land...to be appropriated for the Use of the Church... (in) ... Savannah..." A minister, Dr. Henry Herbert, volunteered without pay to assist settling Georgia by "performing all Religious and Ecclesiastical Offices." He sailed with Oglethorpe aboard the Anne and upon landing at Yamacraw Bluff on February 12, 1733, offered a prayer of thanksgiving and became the first English priest in Georgia. He founded Christ Church (Savannah), Georgia's first parish. From this beginning the church grew and at the 1907 Diocesan Convention meeting in Savannah, a motion was made on May 16, 1907, by the Committee on Division recommending that the Diocese of Georgia be divided into two separate dioceses. The newly create diocese held its "Primary Convention" on December 4, 1907, at Christ Church, Macon, the Diocese's oldest parish. St. Catherine's joined this Diocese of Atlanta at our founding in 1961.



Plans are underway to have a year-long centennial celebration of the Diocese of Atlanta beginning with the 2006 Diocesan Council, Nov. 10-11, in Macon and ending with the 2007 council to be held Nov. 9-10 at the Cathedral.

We envision celebratory events in every corner of the diocese including worship, social celebration, and ministry and outreach projects. Committees are now forming to plan and oversee the celebration. Each of you are invited to serve on a subcommittee: *Archives & History, Communications, Funding & Event Planning, Grants, Music, Outreach/Ministry, Visual Arts.* The Chair for the Diocese Centennial Celebration Committee is Ms. Angela Williamson.

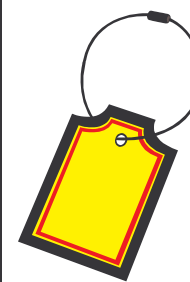

The Alleluia Fund for Mission: Raising Venture Capital for the Great Commission

From *The DioLog* January 2005, by Jim Pritchett, co-chair, Commission on Congregational Growth and Development

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." MATT. 28:19

While in many parts of the country the question is, "Can we find a place which will support an Episcopal Church?" in our diocese, the question is, "How can we begin to put churches in all of the many places that are crying out for them?" In the late 90's, a demographic study identified over forty locations ripe for an Episcopal church. That number has surely increased. God has blessed us with great potential for growth, and with that blessing, as with all blessings, comes the responsibility to respond faithfully.

In light of the abundant blessings God has bestowed on Middle and North Georgia, the Commission on Congregational Growth and Development and our Bishop believe that we must change our strategies for growth. In his address to the 2002 Council of the Diocese, Bishop Alexander charged Congregational Growth and Development with coming up with a "concrete plan of action" to promote growth in our diocese. In response, we submitted a sweeping "Report on Strategies for Starting New Parishes" in May of 2003. In the conclusion to the report, we stated that

the Commission on Congregational Growth and Development has not made modest proposals that involve tweaking our present efforts. We have made sweeping proposals that require great change and commitment. But we have been given a magnificent opportunity in this diocese. We do not know how long it will last. Our current efforts are insufficient, and we believe that the only prudent and faithful course of action is to think big and act big.

At this year's Annual Council of the Diocese, our commission submitted the following:

Be it resolved that the Diocese of Atlanta implement the Alleluia Fund for Mission in order to fulfill an important goal of the 2003 Strategic Plan to establish seven new congregations by the end of this decade and to commit to the renewal and growth of the Episcopal Church in Middle and North Georgia.

... The Alleluia Fund for Mission ("AFM") is an essential step toward [the goal of creating a climate in this Diocese that will joyfully support future growth]. The AFM... will provide every Episcopalian in this Diocese with an annual opportunity, primarily during the Easter season, to support the establishment of new congregations in this diocese. Funds raised will go toward:

- *Hiring new mission developers and providing them with needed support,*
- *Purchasing land proactively,*
- *Establishing an endowment to support new growth in the Diocese for our generation and the next,*
- *Freeing up funds currently budgeted for new starts so that such funds can be used to assist established parishes,*
- *Strengthening the Diocesan budget by increasing the number of parishes in the Diocese (thereby creating greater opportunities for assistance to existing parishes and other diocesan ministries),*
- *"Making new Episcopalians,"*
- *"Widening our circle" by reaching out to communities not typically evangelized by our Church,*
- *Raising the profile of Episcopalians within our Diocese,*
- *Sharing God's love as we fulfill Christ's command to "go and make disciples." (Mt. 28:19), and*
- *Demonstrating that even in times of transition we are committed to raising "venture capital for the Great Commission."*

As we approach the Easter season, you will hear more about the Alleluia Fund for Mission. Whether your gift can be large or must be small, please support this important work.

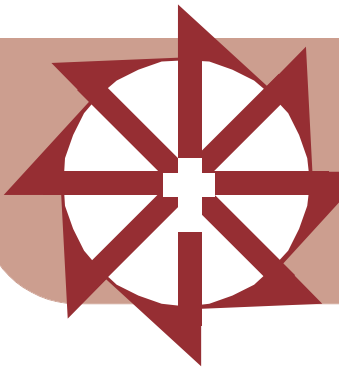
