At The Half Way Point

We are half way through this season of Lent. Inevitably and especially within the church we come to this point ill prepared for what lies ahead: Holy Week and Easter. The temptation is to immerse ourselves in the myriad tasks and intense preparation that lies before us to be ready for the many liturgies that mark the passion, death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord. We who find ourselves in the Church are not immune to the distractions of the world. And while our ministry is important and key to marking these events with dignity and beauty, it is not everything, especially if it distracts from our own Lenten disciplines. I bet you're not much different.

Lent comes into our lives in a season of anticipation. The days grow longer, the sun rises in the sky and steadily warms the earth, the grass starts growing, and spring break plans demand our attention. I think this is good even if terribly demanding and distracting. Our spiritual lives demand attention and the church sees fit to give us

this season where we are called to self examination and repentance, inward and outward reflection and prayer, fasting and self-denial. But life gets the better of us and all of the best laid plans of Lent seem to succumb to the busyness of life even if that busyness is for good things.

And so, I encourage you to hold on. Stay focused on your Lenten discipline as we will strive to do the same in the church. Use the lengthening days, the warmer temperatures, the greening grass, the blooming flowers as powerful reminders of the new life God promises each of us if we but look deep within our hearts and our lives for those little deaths that we must conquer. It is there in every one of us. I invite you as we did some three weeks ago to a holy Lent marked by an inward journey. Where is God calling you to confront those thoughts and behaviors that tear down rather than build up yourself; your family; this community of faith? It is at that place deep within every one of us that you will find hope and a new found holiness to celebrate new life on Easter day.

Holy Week and Easter (cont'd)

➤ Rites of Reconciliation

The clergy of St. Catherine's will again offer the opportunity for private confession (The Reconciliation of a Penitent) during Holy Week. During Lent the Rector's class has been discussing forgiveness. Holy Week is a great time to explore the areas in our own lives where forgiveness would be appropriate. This liturgy is found in our Book of Common Prayer, pages 446-452, if you are interested in exploring this sacrament. The Reconciliation of a Penitent is available for all who desire it. The Anglican tradition has always been that *all people can* avail themselves of this sacrament, *some should*, but *none must*. If you want to explore this sacrament including simply inquiring about it, please contact either Fr. Jim or Sherry for an appointment during Holy Week. Confessions are not restricted to times of sickness. They may be heard anytime and anywhere.



➤ Prayer Vigil

"Then he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, So, could you not stay awake with me one hour? Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

Our custom is to keep Vigil with our Lord through the night from immediately following the Maundy Thursday (April 13) liturgy until Morning Prayer on Good Friday (April 14) at 9:00 AM. The sign up poster will be in the Narthex. Please stop by and find a half-hour or hour period of time you can sit in prayer with Christ in his passion in the garden at Gethesemane. We will have security in the building through the night. Won't you spend one hour with your Lord?

➤ Security for our Prayer Vigil

Our custom for the Prayer Vigil is to provide someone to be at the church during the night, so parishioners coming to pray are not alone. The evening is divided into 3 watches: 9:30pm-12:30am; 12:30-3:30am; 3:30-6:30am. ➤ Monastic Dinner



We will gather after our April 14 Good Friday service for an adult monastic dinner in the Parish Hall immediately following the liturgy. It serves to break our Good Friday fast as we come together in silence and candlelight to enjoy fish stew, bread, and a little wine or other beverage. As the meal progresses it is always a delight to hear the room move from silence to a solemn joy as we anticipate the rest of the story of the death and resurrection of Christ. We will offer some reflective music and reading as we share the meal. Look for the Opportunity for Ministry in your bulletin to sign up and join us.

A Discovery Trip to New Orleans

On Saturday and Sunday, April 1-2, **Fr. Jim, Barbara Perry, Dale Schlenker and Paul Parisi** will travel to New Orleans to explore with the clergy and people of St. George's Episcopal Church the possibility of a partnership relationship. The Vestry has approved this trip and looks forward to the report that they will receive and the opportunities for ministry that will be identified. Earlier this year in a letter to Fr. Jim, the Rector of St. George's, the Rev. Christopher McLaren wrote this:

We are hoping that your church along with other churches across the country will partner with us as we endeavor to overcome the financial, physical and emotional challenges. Right now, we need financial assistance to help meet our insurance deductible and to remain solvent as our community continues to return to New Orleans. We have begun a feeding ministry at St. Georges, called the Dragon Cafe that will offer an evening meal to workers in the city, people returning to clean out and salvage items from their homes, and families in the neighborhood in search of fellowship and a warm, healthy meal. We are in our third week of offering this meal on both Thursday and Friday evenings. In the future we hope to host individuals or teams who would like to come to New Orleans to help rebuild its churches and neighborhoods. We also have an annual Mardi Gras fundraiser which would provide a fun way for people from outside of the city to help.

This trip will enable us to explore together with the leadership of St. George's where St. Catherine's can be most helpful in the long and painful journey that lies ahead, not just for St. George's, but for the community they serve and the larger community of New Orleans. We anticipate a congregational opportunity to hear from our team and about the opportunities for ministry they identify during their trip.

Stephen Ministry

Every couple of years, Saint Catherine's Stephen Ministry recruits people from our congregation to become Stephen Ministers. A Stephen Minister undertakes 50 hours of training to equip him or her to provide one-on-one, medium- to long-term care for people who are dealing with a crisis or otherwise difficult time in their lives.

- *Have you ever shown up at the funeral of someone that you might not have known that well, just to show your support and care for the family?*
- *Have you ever let a family member, friend, or co-worker "pour their heart out" to you, and all they needed was for you to be a good listener?*
- *Have you ever sat quietly at the bedside of a friend who was sick, not necessarily saying anything, but allowing your presence to say everything?*

And perhaps the most important question on which to reflect is:

- *Has anyone in your life been that caring and supportive listener when you were in need?*

Stephen Ministry is looking for a few men and women who want to make a difference in someone's life by simply showing up, listening, and caring. A daunting task? Well, for one who has not only been a Stephen Minister, but who has also had a Stephen Minister to lean on, I can attest that it is far less daunting as it is eminently rewarding.

What is this "Bishop Thing"?



The selection of Father Jim as one of four nominees for Bishop Coadjutor of Northern California has raised a number of questions. If you have a question that doesn't get answered please contact Fr. Jim or Wheel editor Karen Manno. Continuing to answer questions we hear:

- *What will happen to Sherry if Jim is elected?*

In the Episcopal Church, the staff serves at the pleasure of the Rector. A new Rector always has the right and privilege to build a staff that best suits the vision he or she has for the congregation. However, this is what likely would happen. If Jim is elected, Sherry would likely stay as Associate Rector during the interim time while the Vestry forms a search committee and calls a new Rector. The Vestry will hire an interim Rector and they will more than likely want Sherry to stay during this period. Once a new Rector is called it will be up to him or her to decide whether Sherry will be a part of their team.

- *Will we have an opportunity to ask Jim questions about this call?*

Yes, at a forum in the Parish Hall during the Sunday School hour **on Sunday, April 30**. Jim and Joan will be in Northern California from April 22 through April 29. They will participate with the other nominees in a series of five meetings throughout the Diocese over that week. This is an opportunity for the clergy and lay persons of the Diocese to get to know the nominees and to ask them questions. We have decided that upon their return it will be a good opportunity for Jim and Joan to meet with interested members of St. Catherine's to have a similar opportunity and for them to share their feelings about the Diocese and the ramifications of the election process.

- *Will we mark the day of the election in a special way?*

Yes, we are planning a **liturgy on Saturday morning, May 6, at 10:00 AM** at the church. Sherry is working with our staff to plan this liturgy. It will be a time for us to gather as a community to lift Jim and Joan in our prayers and to ask God that His will

be done in Northern California. Our prayer will be as it is now: that the people of Northern California will elect a faithful pastor. We expect that Jim and Joan will spend the rest of the day quietly at home as they await the results of the election.

- *When would Jim leave if elected?*

The election of the next Bishop of Northern California is May 6. Assuming consent to the election from the House of Bishops and House of Deputies at General Convention in Columbus, OH, the consecration of the Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of Northern California will be September 30 in Sacramento, CA. It is more than likely that Jim would then leave at the end of August or early September.

➤ RITE 13: Are you a "Grown-Up"?

In our society, the line between childhood and adulthood is often a fuzzy one. Unlike other cultures, we don't have formalized rites of passage that define the points along the path to adulthood. We need ways to tell our young people they are becoming adults. During the regular 8:45 service on **Sunday, March 26**, we will celebrate an important Rite of Passage. This liturgy is formally called "**The Celebration of Manhood and Womanhood**", but is more well-known as "Rite-13" since it takes place near the candidate's 13th Birthday – much like a bar mitzvah or bat mitzvah. During the ceremony, we recognize the gift of womanhood or manhood that God bestows on each one of us. These are the teenagers who we will celebrate and recognize on March 26:

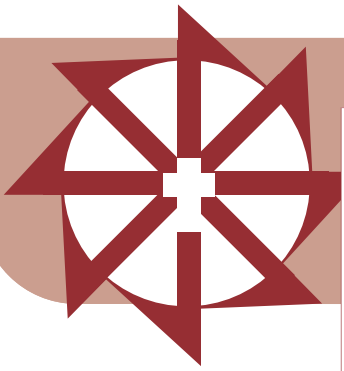

➤ Stephen Nicholson Memorial Hike

The first Stephen Nicholson Memorial Hike is planned for **Saturday, May 13**, as an all-day hike to Hemlock Falls on Moccasin Creek in north Georgia. The hike starts at the Lake Burton Hatchery and goes for 2.5 miles along the Moccasin Creek trail. We visit the hatchery first to see the fish being fed, then move on to the hike. The hike includes two gorgeous waterfalls, a stream fording, and possible swim in the pond at the bottom of the second waterfalls. While it is alongside a mountain stream, there are some fairly difficult areas crossing ravines and stepping on rocks to cross the stream, so be prepared for a hike of medium difficulty.
