
## Becoming who you're meant to be

I have recently re-visited the book, *Let Your Life Speak* by Parker J. Palmer. He offers an interesting understanding of the meaning of vocation—an especially important topic during graduation time:

*Today I understand vocation not as a goal to be achieved but as a gift to be received. Discovering vocation does not mean scrambling toward some prize just beyond my reach but accepting the treasure of true self I already possess. Vocation does not come from a voice "out there" calling me to become something I am not. It comes from a voice "in here" calling me to be the person I was born to be, to fulfill the original selfhood given me at birth by God. It is a strange gift, this birthright gift of self.*

*Accepting it turns out to be even more demanding than attempting to become someone else! I have sometimes, responded to that demand by ignoring the gift, or hiding it, or fleeing from it, or squandering it—and I think I am not alone. There is a Hasidic tale that reveals, with amazing brevity, both the universal tendency to want to be someone else and the ultimate importance of becoming one's self: Rabbi Zusya, when he was an old man, said, "In the coming world, they will not ask me: 'Why were you not Moses?' They will ask me: 'Why were you not Zusya?'"*

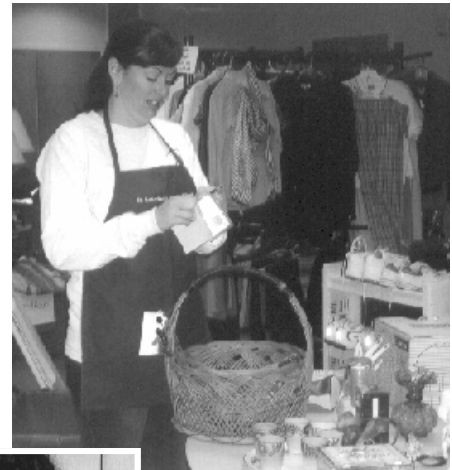


**From the May 16

Our Spring Yard sale on April 29 was a great success. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard, and thank you to everyone who donated items, and shopped, too!

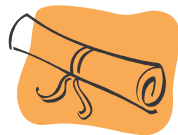


## Adopt a garden

## Doves for Pentecost



Many of you may remember the Opening Ceremonies of the Olympics in Atlanta in 1996. As the torch was lit and the games began, 100 children marched onto the field, waving custom made doves on long bamboo sticks. Olympic Committee rules dictate, that by tradition, live doves be released at the Opening Ceremonies. In 1996, a decision was made that would not utilize live doves. A very special lady was found to design and produce, in total secrecy, the special kite forms that would be the doves of peace to the world. It is one of these doves you will see at St. Catherine's on select occasions.

This Pentecost, St. Catherine's will have our own dove in the Processional to honor this holy day in our church. The dove is white, a form of kite or banner, carried by an acolyte. It symbolizes peace and love, from our Lord, for our Lord. Why on Pentecost? Research indicates Pentecost is the time when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in Jerusalem and they were empowered to preach to people from every nation who had come to Jerusalem for the feast. The Acts of the Apostles records that about 3,000 were added to their number that day. Christians since have considered this event to be the founding of the church. Pentecost means "fiftieth day," and is the beginning of the longest day of the church year. It continues until the first Sunday in Advent.

In some churches, Pentecost is known as Whitsunday, after the white robes once worn by candidates for baptism on that day. We will also carry our dove on baptism days.

## New Orleans Project

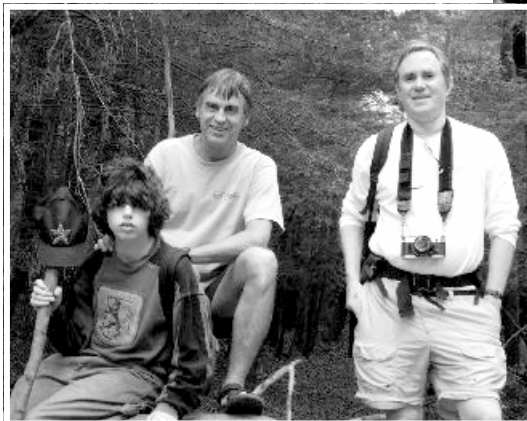

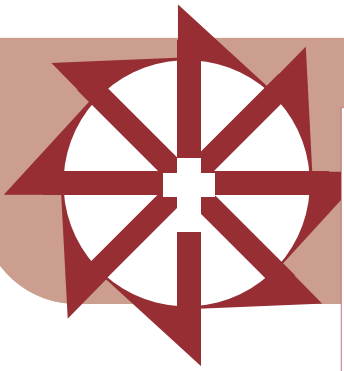
