The Feast of Pentecost, Sunday May 30, is celebrated each year on the fiftieth day after the Great Feast of Easter and ten days after the Feast of the Ascension of Christ. The Feast is always celebrated on a Sunday.

The Feast commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles on the day of Pentecost, a feast of the Jewish tradition. It also celebrates the establishment of the Church through the preaching of the Apostles and the baptism of the thousands who on that day believed in the Gospel message of salvation through Jesus Christ.

The story of Pentecost is found in the book of The Acts of the Apostles. In chapter two we are told that the Apostles of our Lord were gathered together in one place. Suddenly, a sound came from heaven like a rushing wind, filling the entire house where they were sitting. Then, tongues of fire appeared, and one sat upon each one of Apostles. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as directed by the Spirit (Acts 2:1-4).

This miraculous event occurred on the Jewish Feast of Pentecost, celebrated by the Jews on the fiftieth day after the Passover as the culmination of the Feast of Weeks (Exodus 34:22; Deuteronomy 16:10). The Feast of Weeks began on the third day after the Passover with the presentation of the first harvest sheaves to God, and it concluded on Pentecost with the offering of two loaves of unleavened bread, representing the first products of the harvest (Leviticus 23:17-20; Deuteronomy 16:9-10).

Since the Jewish Feast of Pentecost was a great pilgrimage feast, many people from throughout the Roman Empire were gathered in Jerusalem on this day. When the

people in Jerusalem heard the sound, they came together and heard their own languages being spoken by the Apostles (Acts 2:5-6). The people were amazed, knowing that some of those speaking were Galileans, and not men who would normally speak many different languages. They wondered what this meant, and some even thought the Apostles were drunk (Acts 2:7-13).

Peter, hearing these remarks, stood up and addressed the crowd. He preached to the people regarding the Old Testament prophecies about the coming of the Holy Spirit. He spoke about Jesus Christ and His death and glorious Resurrection. Great conviction fell upon the people, and they asked the Apostles, "What shall we do?" Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38-39).

The Bible records that on that day about three thousand were baptized. Following, the book of Acts states that the newly baptized continued daily to hear the teaching of the Apostles, as the early Christians met together for fellowship, the breaking of bread, and for prayer. Many wonderful signs and miracles were done through the Apostles, and the Lord added to the Church daily those who were being saved (Acts 2:42-47).

Our celebration of this feast day will also mark Deacon Judy Padgett's last day with us at St. Catherine's. We hope that you will come and celebrate this day. Be sure to **wear red** as a sign of the Spirit and the tongues of flame that sat on each Apostle. There will be **special reception between services (10:15 AM)** honoring Judy and her nearly six years of ministry with us.

The people of St. Catherine's seek to share in the love that Jesus Christ has for us and the world by welcoming, accepting, nurturing, and serving all people through the power of the Holy Spirit.

As We Shape a Safer World

I just returned from Preschool Graduation. My sixth! This one, however, was different from the others, I suspect not because it was held at a different place (Holt Road Baptist Church), but because I am at a different place.

Each year we watch 50-60 four year old children pass from our lives into the greater world. Of course, not all of them do because many of them are members of our community of faith and we will see them continue to grow into young men and women in the world. But for many others we may not see them again or at best occasionally. I sat watching them wondering what was to become of them in the years ahead. No doubt I was watching future doctors and nurses, pastors, lawyers, MBA graduates, moms and dads, engineers, small business owners, etc. as they received their diplomas and got their pictures taken some real hams, others struggling just to find the camera.

Later I went to pick up a bite to eat at Atlanta Bread Company and the parents of one of our graduates were there with family and friends celebrating the big day. As I waited for my lunch both mom and dad approached me. They wanted me to know how much the preschool meant to them

and the years they had been part of it. They both said they are sad to leave. I didn't know their names and still don't, but their kindness once again reminded me of the power of this ministry. The mom told me that her daughter was well prepared academically for kindergarten after she suggested that maybe she'd like to have her daughter do it all over again. We laughed at the notion of repeating preschool. I talked about the love we have for our children and she agreed. Then she turned serious. *St. Catherine's is such a safe place. I m anxious about her going into a bigger and unsafe world. I wish she could stay in the safe environment.*

I've learned a lot these past months between the controversy of the fall and the fire. I've learned that we are, indeed a safe place not because we all think alike but exactly because we don't all think alike and that is okay even if a bit disconcerting at times. A bit of a paradox, isn't it? One would think the place to be safe is where everyone thinks alike, but that is not reality. No such place exists except in someone's mind. And to think differently or at least to express different thoughts in such a place is really unsafe. The place to be safe is that place

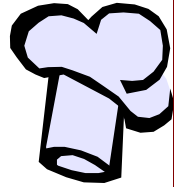
Lemonade Brigade

In between the rain storms the crews are busy constructing the roof structure. The decking has been completed on the lower Sanctuary roof and the trusses in the high roof should be completed soon, then the decking can be finished. Afterwards the electricians will be busy running the electrical work for the Sanctuary lights. The architect is completing the plans for the canopy to the Educational Wing as well as the Parish Hall entrance.

The Liturgical Furniture sub-committee chose the artist who will create the glass artwork over the Baptismal Font, as well as

the glass on the Lectern and Umbry. They have worked very hard and are thrilled with their choice. The Playground Committee has worked diligently with the architect and with a playground design company and hope to have final designs and figures settled on by next week. Our Preschool, which graduated their Pre-K students this past week, has packed up and is storing their equipment and supplies in the mobile learning cottage already located at Holt Road Baptist. They look forward to moving back to St. Catherine's in August in preparation for opening their new school year in September.

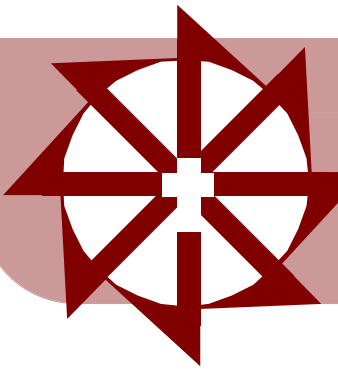
