Partners in Mission and Ministry

Each week we pray for our partner parishes; St. Elizabeth's in Whiterocks and St. George's in New Orleans. Both partnerships continue to be nurtured and served by a committed group of people who care deeply for these ministries. Each partnership in its own way feeds the spiritual center of our life together at St. Catherine's. St. Elizabeth's helps us to learn to embrace and serve fellow Christians who differ from us in culture but seek to know God as we do. St. George's helps us to learn to serve those who have lost much and seek to find a way to bring new life and renewed energy to their community of faith. There is significant activity in each place and I thought you might want to know about it.

Two major events are planned in our relationship with St. Elizabeth's. First we are exploring ways to jointly develop a covenant in our relationship. This means asking the people of St. Elizabeth's and the people of St. Catherine's to look to the future of this partnership and to covenant with one another to seek God's will for our community together. In August, the Rev. Sue Duffield will be in Atlanta to continue our discussion of this process. In November members of St. Elizabeth's and St. Catherine's will meet in Jamestown, VA to celebrate 400 years of the Episcopal Church and the Second Decade of Remembrance, Recognition, and Reconciliation. There we will affirm the New Jamestown Covenant

as a "living sign of the renewal of the centuries old relationship between the Indigenous people of the Americas and the Anglican Community." **You will be hearing more about this visit and we invite you to be a part of the trip.**

Next week a group of us will return to St. George's in New Orleans to continue our presence and support among that congregation. We will support the Dragon Café as well as work in the Ninth Ward gutting and/or rebuilding houses. We will stay at St. George's rectory and some of us will support the congregation in their everyday life as they continue to recover from the ravishes of Katrina nearly two years ago. The exciting news is they have now called a new rector, the Rev. Jim Quigley from Bowling Green, KY. I will be joining them in August as they continue their journey. I will also preach and celebrate at St. George's on July 29 in celebration of their last Sunday before their new rector arrives. In addition, we are working on a trip to St. George's in September that will be coordinated with the 3 other parishes across the United States who are partners in this relationship. This trip, we believe, will foster more cooperation and energy between all the parishes as we seek to support St. George's in their ministry to the people of New Orleans. **We hope that you will be able to make this trip and join us in this ministry.**

Borderlands Trip Reflection

The Women's Journey for Spiritual Deepening, June 24-June 1: I've been blessed with the opportunity to travel on close to a dozen spiritually focused trips and I still struggle with answering that well-intentioned and sincere question from friends and family when I return home — "How was your trip?"

Unlike vacations, pilgrimage and "teaching travel" has for me a quality that always brings me up short for an answer to those who want to share in my experience. The short answer is that our trip to Borderlands was wonderful. The longer answer goes like this: it was trying at times and it was exhausting. It was challenging — personally and corporately. It was also fun and full of laughter and in many ways; it was like being at summer camp. Our surroundings were breathtaking and we were privileged to have sat at the feet of two of the best teachers of Native American Spirituality - Dr. Martin Brokenleg and Ben Rhodd. Linda Kramer, our hostess for the week, also taught us and guided us through eye-opening experiences which will stay with me for a life time.

Borderlands is a ranch in the Black Hills of South Dakota. Linda has just recently found out that her ranch is located in the geographic center of the sacred land of the Lakota. Nestled in the rolling landscape of the Black Hills, Linda's home has several out buildings including a chapel. There is a labyrinth, built by hand with rocks from the property by Amelia Snider and a couple of

other people. There are horses and chickens, a new baby mule, and two watch dogs named Spooky and Grady. Meals were an important part of our community time and were enjoyed mostly outside on the decks on either side of the house.

We traveled quite a bit as Linda took us to important Lakota sites in the area. We did a prayer walk up Flag Mountain and visited the Badlands and Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. We prayed at Wounded Knee and Bear Butte. We drove through the buffalo reserve close to Custer National park where we saw over 100 head of buffalo. We ate lunch in Betty's kitchen — literally (Betty is the great-granddaughter of Nicholas Black Elk). We experienced a Sweat Lodge ceremony and smoked the Peace Pipe. All this and we even had time to shop and visit the winery!

It will take much more time for me to sift through the experiences of my week in South Dakota and then some more time to be able to articulate and integrate the lessons of the journey. What I can say now is that I have a new and deeply profound understanding of *relationship*. Upon entering the Sweat Lodge, one bows deeply and says the words, "Mitakuye Owasin" ("all" is something to me). We are related to ALL — to the earth and the sky and the birds and the animals and to each other. I now have a deeper awareness of what that means — the trick now is for me to become more and more intentional about living out of that place.

The word from the Finance Committee

Continuing our monthly, easy-to-read, highlights-only report on the state of St. Catherine's finances, this month is mostly

Good News. In June pledges came in over budget for the month and expenses remained below budget so we made up ground. Thank you all! Please keep it up through the summer.

Highlights -

1. Faithful Mission continues strong.
2. Our Expenses so far this year continue to be 3% lower than budget.
3. Our year-to-date income is 4.5% higher than last year, up from 3% ahead of 2006 last month. However, we are still 6% below annual budget. (We were 8% below budget at the end of May.)

4. Primary increases in expenditures for this year over last year are income and benefits for the Clergy and Staff and an increase in year-to-date expenditures for Outreach due to incorporating Pledge Plus into the budget and to a change in the pattern of spending for Outreach.

5. Our expenditures so far this year have exceeded our income by a little over \$9,000. This is not unexpected since we usually fall behind in the summer and we have the reserve funds to cover the shortage until the fall when we traditionally catch up.

6. We are currently still in good financial shape, but it is very important that we meet our pledges during the summer.

Thank all of you for your continued financial support for God's work at St. Catherine's.

St. Cat's Greeters

Our greeters remain at the church entrance during the first 5-10 minutes of the service to welcome last minute guests. Following the service, greeters are available to the clergy. Their function at this time is to continue to welcome and assist our newcomers and visitors. Please feel free to greet your friends, however, it is important to allow the greeters to remain available to the clergy and not engage in extended social conversation. It is crucial that greeters be allowed to fulfill their ministry to our guests.

You can help our newcomers by wearing your name tag and making them feel welcome. Introduce them to fellow parishioners, greeters and clergy and encourage them to sign the guest register if they haven't already done so. Thank you to all the acolytes, staff, clergy and parents for their donations of time, talent and treasure to make this dinner




