A Stewardship Journey

I am finding—as I know you are—that life well lived is more about the journey than the destination. In fact, I wonder if there is a destination and that the whole point of living life faithfully is engaging the questions and seeing where they take you.

Our stewardship journey began there—with questions. We had just returned to the church with two small kids, a mortgage, a couple of new cars, and all the bills to go with it, and our parish priest started talking about stewardship. Our first reaction was the same as the majority of Christians when they hear the language of stewardship rolled out each year. “Ah, they’re about to shake us down for money.” Thankfully, we listened a bit more and discovered in the words of our rector an incredible journey we’ve been on since the early 1980’s. And that it is, a journey. We’ve arrived at some of our stewardship goals, like tithing, but there are others that God continues to reveal to us. I don’t know what Joan thinks, but I think God might be inviting us to move past the tithe; God is inviting both of us to be better stewards of our time together; our relationship.

Stewardship is, at its best, an opportunity to stop and reflect on what God in Christ Jesus means to us and how his presence has changed our lives. Joan and I have been blessed and there is nothing that we can give to God that would ever be adequate to give thanks. We try, however, to

give to the church and others as a way of saying thank you. Each year we stop and reflect on our blessings, financial and otherwise, return a portion to God for God’s work, and determine where we’d like to give our time and talent over the coming year. We try to make it an intentional time, but too often slip into an automatic mode. Yet, it doesn’t seem as satisfying when we don’t take the time to reflect, pray, and make intentional decisions.

You will find a great deal about stewardship in this newsletter. It’s that time of year. Yes, we do need financial resources to support our ministry, let’s not kid anyone. But we need more than money, we need you — your heart, your mind and your soul. I invite you to take some risks this year. Listen! First, come to one of the Celebration Dinners and enjoy fellowship, good food, and conversation (we won’t ask for money, but we will give you the Stewardship Case Statement and a Pledge Card). Second, make a list of the blessings God has given you this past year; time, talents, and treasure. Third, sit down and pray, thanking God for the abundance God has given you. Fourth, return a portion of that abundance to God for work in this part of the kingdom. And last of all come to church and join the celebration on November 11 as we look to the future of this congregation and what is possible through our many gifts.

Get on the journey—the stewardship journey.

Your Stephen Ministry is looking for a few good men and women

Every couple of years, Saint Catherine's Stephen Ministry recruits and trains people from our congregation to become Stephen Ministers. We are now in the process of identifying those individuals to comprise our new class of trainees.

A Stephen Minister undertakes 50 hours of training to equip him or her to provide one-on-one medium to long-term care for people who are dealing with a crisis or otherwise difficult time in their lives. Does the idea of becoming a Stephen Minister seem daunting? If you think it does, just reflect on these simple questions:

- Have you ever shown up at the funeral of someone that you might not have known that well, just to show your support and care for the family?
- Have you ever let a family member, friend, or co-worker "pour their heart out" to you, and all they needed was for you to be a good listener?
- Have you ever sat quietly at the bedside of a friend who was sick, not necessarily saying anything, but allowing your presence to say everything?

And perhaps the most important question on which to reflect is:

- Has anyone in your life been that caring and supportive listener when you were in need?

Stephen Ministry is looking for a few men and women who want to make a difference in someone's life by simply showing up, listening, and caring. A daunting task? Well, for one who has not only been a Stephen Minister, but who has also had a Stephen Minister to lean on I can attest that it is far less daunting as it is eminently rewarding.

Free Mammogram Opportunity

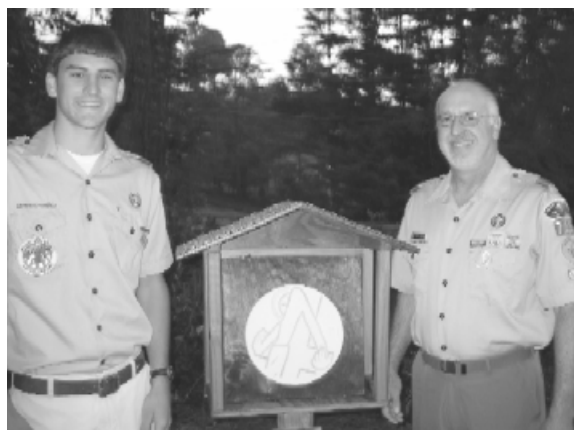

This is a great opportunity to advocate for those women who would otherwise not be able to get a mammogram. Eligibility criteria include:

1. Age 40 and older;
2. No mammogram within the past year;
3. No insurance;
4. Citizen of U.S.;
5. Certain criteria for household income.

Eagle Scout creates Outdoor Stations of the Cross

In years past, St. Catherine's has offered the Stations of the Cross at noon and in the evening on Good Friday. Now with the help of Eagle Scout, Thomas Pilliod, we can walk the Way of the Cross at any time. With the approval of Father Jim and Boy Scout Troop 713, Thomas constructed the fourteen stations around the perimeter of the church grounds so that they would match the natural setting. Each station houses a sandstone disk depicting Jesus' journey to his death.

The journey begins with the First Station, titled "Jesus is condemned to death," and ends with the Fourteenth Station, titled "Jesus is buried." Walking the stations of the cross not only offers a time of contemplation and meditation on Jesus' life but

also gives us a place to reflect on our own lives and our own crosses that we carry.

We invite you to encounter the outdoor Stations of the Cross at St. Catherine's. The first station is located in the garden near the crepe myrtle where you will find a liturgy and map to serve as a guide.

Posted on one wall of the house was this prayer left by earlier volunteers from a church in Texas.:

Let us remember the damage done by Hurricane Katrina and help us to remember those who lived and loved with hope & joy in these rooms. The gift of organ donation is an overwhelming event as you might imagine. And your presence in our lives during this event brought us even closer to God and sustained us throughout!

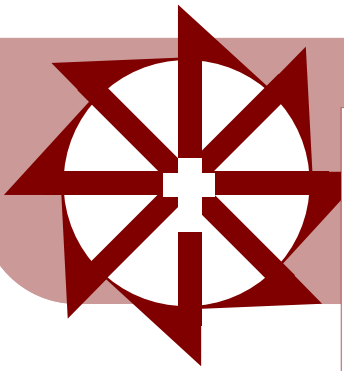

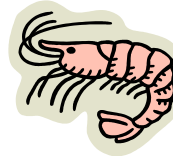
