Guest Choir to sing on October 29

The Sollentuna Musikklasser (Music School) Choir from the city of Sollentuna, Sweden, will be our guest choir for worship at 8:45 and 11:15 services. They will sing a variety of songs in English and Swedish for us. The choir is a group of 20 girls and 10 boys ages 14 to 16 touring the southeastern US who will make a weekend stop in the Atlanta area. Choir members and their chaperones will be hosted by parishioners for their 2-night stay. We look forward to a wonderful music experience during worship this day.

The Swedish choir tradition is very famous worldwide. The population of Sweden is

approx. 9 million and 600,000 people sing in choirs! The Sollentuna Musikklasser has 350 students, ages 10-15. All students must audition for the school. The choir's conductors are Helena Ahman and Gisela Hol-Ternstrom. Educated at the Royal Music Academy of Stockholm. Helena Ahman has been a teacher at Sollentuna Musikklasser since 1990, is a free lance singer herself and has created music education programs for the Swedish Television Company. Gisela Hol-Ternstrom was educated at the Royal Music Academy of Stockholm, and has been a teacher at Sollentuna Musikklasser since 1988. Gisela has presented courses for choir conductors in Sweden and Scandinavia. She teaches at the Royal Music Academy and cooperates with the Stockholm Opera.

On Stewardship:

The Widow's Mite

The 4-verse description of the Widow's donation appears identically, word for word, in the gospels of both Mark and Matthew. Truly, Christ tells us, the two small coins she gave were all that she had to live on — all that she had to live on.

To help understand scripture, I try to imagine myself in the place of those described. Imagine, if you can, the Widow's motivation to make a donation of all that she had to live on. We aren't told why, but when I considered the possibilities, I think it is probable her gift was made in gratitude. Imagine, if you can, her trust when she gave away all she had.

Others in the Temple that day gave from their abundance. I understand that. I give from my abundance. Perhaps that's how almost everyone in our great country makes donations—from our abundance. Abundance is wealth, more than is needed. Recently, I read that those who are wealthy tend to be careless. The idea being that if something is available in excess, there's the chance that we might not spend the effort required to be sure there is no waste.



There may be other limitations that accompany abundance. For example, if we are blessed with abundance, is it as easy to be thankful for the gifts we have received? In other words, excess may breed indifference. Having an abundance might cause us to be less trusting. If we have more than we need, can we trust God to maintain that excess wealth? Why even be thankful? There's so much it seems almost limitless.

Even in the richness of America, there are wide differences in the allocation of abundance. Wealth ranges all the way from Bill Gates and his billions of dollars to the poverty of the homeless among us. However, everyone has the same 24-hours each day, 7-days each week, whether it's Bill Gates or a person here in Marietta who stays at the MUST Ministries shelter.

We thank God for the time He gives us. In thinking about Christ's observations about the Widow's donation, I wondered if there's any parallel in our use of time and the Widow's contribution. What use of our time could be equivalent to the Widow's mite? Time is all that we have, all that we have to live on. Can we try to be like the Widow and give it all to God's use?

2007 Budget Process

The St. Catherine's Finance Committee has set the calendar for the 2007 budgeting process. Consistent with our philosophy, the Finance Committee will present a balanced budget to the Vestry for approval. The balanced budget will be largely derived from the 2007 pledges received (Our Income) and the budget requests submitted by each ministry team (Our Expenses). Below you will find the key dates for the 2007 budgeting process.

- Nov 7 – Finance Committee distributes budget requests to ministry team leaders
- Dec 9 – Budget requests are due from the ministry teams
- Dec 16 – Finance Committee initial review of ministry team requests
- Dec 19 – Finance Committee reports ministry team requests and status of 2007 pledges
- Jan 6 – Finance Committee presents balanced budget to ministry team leaders for feedback (all are welcome)
- Jan 13 – Tentative Finance Committee meeting for final review of budget prior to Vestry submission
- Jan 16 – Finance Committee submits 2007 balanced budget to Vestry for review and approval
- Jan 21 – Final budget presented at the Annual Meeting

How Does One Become a Deacon?

Some of you may be wondering about the process involved in becoming a deacon in the Episcopal Church. I thought I would put together a “thumbnail sketch” of how that works in our diocese.

As I explained in my last article, the diaconate is one of three Holy Orders in our Church tradition. Deacons are ordained clergy and function within a parish as well as outside of the parish. Deacons are “agents of the Church under the authority of the Bishop.” That is, deacons report directly to the Bishop while at the same time they work in partnership with the rectors of the parish to which they are assigned.

In our diocese, a lay person must have four years of EFM or two years of seminary and the recommendation of their parish vestry and clergy in order to begin the process for the vocational diaconate. This process begins with an application to the diocese for consideration to enter into discernment for the diaconate. Once accepted, a year of discernment is begun where the *aspirant* meets monthly with a supervised group for processing of ministry experiences. Aspirants are required to place themselves in various ministry environments such as hospices, prisons, homeless shelters, etc. and then process their experiences with the supervision group through the presentation of a verbatim. After a year, the group supervisors recommend or don't recommend an aspirant to the diocese for ordination. Upon recommendation, an aspirant meets with the Diocesan Commission on Ministry and, if recommended, becomes a *postulant*. As a postulant, one is required to meet monthly for two years for coursework on parish dynamics, scripture, church history, spirituality, pastoral care, liturgy, and diaconal ministry. Once the coursework is completed and the postulant is determined to be proficient in these areas, she/he meets with the Diocesan Standing Committee and is or isn't recommended as

a *candidate* for ordination. Candidates are presented to the Bishop at ordination by representatives of the parish community which recommended them and people who have supported and encouraged the candidate in his/her journey to ordination.

It may be interesting here to note some of the symbolic differences in the Ordination service of a deacon and a priest. In the Diocese of Atlanta, ordination into the priesthood is typically held at the parish into which a candidate for the priesthood has accepted a call from the rector or the search committee. This honors the “call” from the particular parish to the new priest. Ordination into the diaconate (vocational or transitional) takes place at the Cathedral symbolizing the ministry of the diaconate to the whole of the diocese under the authority of the bishop. The vows of a priest are focused on the care and nurture of a “community” of Episcopalians – a parish. A deacon is vowed to involvement with the poor, sick, and needy of the world; obedience to the Bishop; and assistance to the Bishop and priests in public worship. At the consecration of a priest, the bishop and other priests lay hands on the head of the ordinand asking for God's grace and power to form and inform her/his ministry in the Church. The consecration of a deacon is bestowed upon the diaconal ordinand through the laying on of hands by only the Bishop.


