Stewardship Pledges and Prayers



We continue to receive pledges for 2005. As of this week we have 153 pledges for \$425,206. In 2004 we had 183 pledges for \$490,919. As you can see we have a ways to go to finish this year's stewardship campaign. We have not yet heard from 37 households who pledged \$65,372 in 2004.

The Vestry reviewed the financial situation on Tuesday evening, but was unable to draw any conclusions about the 2005 budget. The best scenario is that we will have approximately the same income in 2005 as we had in 2004. The worst scenario is that we could have a substantial gap between expenses and income. This gap does not include some scheduled expense increases (janitorial service, debt set-aside, utilities, etc.) in 2005. In any case without the 37 pledges outstanding and several new pledges, there will be budget cuts for 2005.

The magnitude of the cuts we face mean that we can only find such money in one or all of three areas: reduced staff salaries and benefits, reduced outreach, and/or reduced building debt set-aside. Reducing anyone of these three areas to any degree will be very difficult and painful. As a Vestry we agreed to submit this situation to prayer and God's guidance. We invite the congregation to do the same.

What can you do? First, pray with us that God will guide us through this dilemma. If you pledged in 2004 and have not yet pledged for 2005, please do so as soon as possible. If you have not pledged to St. Catherine's in the past or are new to our community, please consider making a pledge for 2005. Every new pledge will make a substantial difference next year. Pray for discernment for your Vestry. They are committed to a balanced budget based on your commitments to the mission and ministry of St. Catherine's. We've had plenty of evidence of God's grace this past year and such evidence will sustain us through this time of difficult decisions.

Father Jim has even volunteered to lead us in a midnight Eucharist.

How could you possibly want to miss this? And just for giggles, we'll toss in all the caffeine and sugar-induced hysterics you remember from yesteryear, no extra charge. C'mon, you don't get a free ride on a time machine just every day, you know.
