Let me hear; let me hear!

We began our Tuesday morning Eucharist and study this morning. It is always a special time of the day for me even though the alarm does demand my attention at 5:30 am. There is something very holy and peaceful about a group of the faithful gathering in the pre-dawn darkness of the sanctuary and, indeed, the world to start the day sharing the Word, prayers and the body and blood of Jesus and then a cup of coffee and a discussion about our faith. For those who have made this opportunity a part of their Advent and Lent disciplines, we agree, we could not sustain this service 52 weeks a year, but for 10 weeks out of the year it is a very special time.

This morning as we prepared for worship we listened to a Celtic chant: *Let me hear, let me hear what you have to say to me when I look into my heart.* In addition to some beautiful music and singing, the chant pressed upon me from all sides. *Let me hear; let me hear.* During a time of Lenten self-examination is this not what we are about? In our culture we speak often of communication so often that I don't think we stop to think what it really is. Even in

the church when there s a problem to be solved inevitably someone will play the communication card.

As I listened to the chant this morning, I wondered. How often do I really look deep inside and hear what God is saying to me as I look at my life and the circumstances surrounding it? I don't mean to listen or to be able to repeat back but to hear. One definition of to hear is to listen to and consider favorably. How often do I pray, Lord, hear my prayer! and expect God to consider favorably my intercession or thanksgiving. This morning I wondered how often God yearns deeply that I hear what He has to say to me when I look into my heart and to consider it favorably.

I think I'll listen a bit more attentively in the future and pray that I hear what is being spoken to me. In the meantime I'll remember those haunting words of this morning as the sun rose outside and my companions on the journey arrived in the dimly lit sanctuary: *Let me hear, let me hear what you have to say to me when I look into my heart.*

Worshiping Together



During this season of Lenten discipline it seems a good time to remind ourselves of some of the courtesies that enhance our worship experience. These observations are based on the following premise:

Worship in the Episcopal Church is not simply adoration or praise of God, but taking part in the [redeeming] actions of God in Christ in human history. Each week we retell the story of God's willingness to intervene in history on our behalf. In our worship, God speaks to us through the Bible, through prayer, and through our actions together, reminding us of God's love for us and calling to us to join in the redemptive work of reconciling the world to God (the saving work of bringing the world to God in Christ Jesus).

Our work (liturgy = the work of the people) on Sunday mornings is enhanced when we make a commitment to one another to observe certain courtesies of worship. Unfortunately, the reverse is equally true, when we cannot or will not observe these courtesies, the experience of worship is diminished for all.

1. Arrive in time to find a good place to sit. If you have children, sit up front where your child has an unobstructed view of the altar. It is so distracting to everyone when our congregation is still arriving after 20 minutes of worship. If you must arrive late please wait in the Narthex until the Ushers invite you to enter the worship space.

2. Find time to greet your friends in the Foyer but not in the Narthex. We added a distinctive Narthex to our building renovation to offer a "buffer zone" between the Foyer (the space just inside the front doors) and the Sanctuary. The space between the two walls of glass the Narthex should be considered a quiet zone especially before our worship. In addition, we often need the Narthex to prepare our worship participants for the opening of the liturgy. If you are going to worship, please proceed into the sanctuary.

3. Take time to silently prepare yourself for worship. Reading the Scriptures of the day (included in your bulletin) or praying the collect of the day (also in the bulletin) is one way to prepare for what is about to happen. This is not a time to carry on loud conversations with friends. If you don't want to pray, remember, there are others who do.

Celebration of Solemn Communion

First through Fifth Grade children are invited to a time set aside to deepen their understanding of how our relationship with Jesus is lived out through the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation in the Celebration of Solemn Communion. We will meet on Sundays from February 10 to March 9 in the Level II atrium from 10 am to 12 pm to intentionally prepare to participate in these sacraments. To culminate their preparations, the children will have a Children's Retreat on Saturday, March 29, 9 am - 3 pm. They will have an opportunity during the retreat to experience the Sacra-

ment of Reconciliation with Father Jim and to participate in a family liturgy for the Renewal of Baptismal Promises. Then, the children will come to communion together as a group on Sunday, March 30, at the 8:45 service.

Please discuss this opportunity with your child and decide together if this is something that they would like to do. This is the second time we are offering this preparation at St. Catherine's and we anticipate that it will again be a peaceful, joyful, and memorable experience. Did You Know? - On Pilgrimage with St. Catherine's

Did you know that there are two ways to climb Mount Sinai? Both paths lead to natural amphitheater known as Elijah's Hollow, where you'll find a teahouse for a break. From there, it's a final 750 steps (30 minutes) to reach the summit.

- *Steps of Penitence:* This aptly named steep path has been quite literally carved out of the rock by monks and with 3750 steps to climb is the shorter but more challenging of the two.

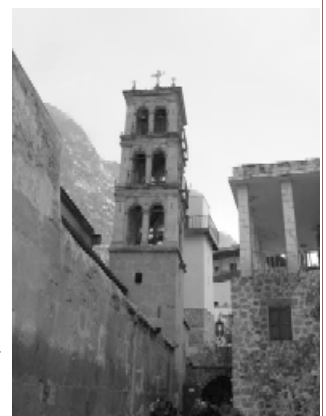
- *Camel Path:* A gentler, winding, wide path that snakes its way up to the summit that can be completed by the average traveler in 2.5 hours.

At the top you will find a small chapel dedicated to the Holy Trinity, constructed in 1934 on the ruins of an older 16th-century church. Better yet, we'll time our ascent, so you can see the sunrise over the parched, rocky expanse of the Sinai.

Mount Sinai is said to be the place where Moses received the Ten Commandments from God. The mountain is a popular pilgrimage site and home to the Monastery of St. Catherine, our patron. A Greek Orthodox monastery founded in the 6th century, it is one of the longest-running monasteries in the world and is at the supposed location of the Burning Bush.

Join us March 13-24, 2009, for a pilgrimage to holy sites in Egypt and Jordan. *Following the Footsteps of Moses and Jesus* will provide each pilgrim the chance to climb Mt. Sinai using the second path option. Brochures are available in the Foyer. 2008 Vestry Retreat Reflection

As I drive up 400 the day is waning and a steady stream of taillights recedes in my rear view mirror. The road narrows from 6 to 4 and finally 2 lanes as I am now surrounded by the country side. I am enveloped by rolling hills, forests, horses and catch a fleeting scene of a flock of wild turkeys scurrying in the adjacent pasture scrounging for that last meal of the day.

I am a bit melancholy as I realize this will be my last vestry retreat. This weekend has, for the last 3 years, been a time of fellowship, reflection, team building and discernment of God's will for this wonderful faith community we call St Catherine's.

We spend time laughing, praying, crying, and listening for that quiet voice to lead us. Did I mention we laugh?

Vestry retreat is that time when we as a vestry search for that path God has placed before us. We brainstorm ideas, boil them down and determine where we will go for the next calendar year and beyond. Some years more difficult than others but this year we have a bit of a head start. In 2007 we initiated a Mutual Ministry Review that was a process to Identify strengths and weaknesses within our Parish by surveying approximately 100 congregants identified as "Church Leaders". With those results in hand our objective this year is to consolidate that information into a working plan of Goals and processes that we can implement within our framework of Ministry Teams.

Some of you may have noticed in the last few weeks Father Jim has stepped down out of the pulpit to deliver several sermons. This is a direct result from comments and feedback from our survey. His actions are invigorating to me as a parishioner because it is direct evidence how eager Jim and this

vestry are to make necessary changes to keep pace with the growth, feedback and spiritual direction of this congregation.

This year at Montara Farm a group of 16 people became a cohesive team in 3 short days. We found out we are from Texas to Maine to Mattoon, Illinois, even native Atlantans. We are physicians, nurses, homemakers, engineers, aspiring architects and pilots. We prayed, shared ideas, discussed differences, rode horses, hiked, were massaged, relaxed, laughed AND WE ATE!!

Did I mention we Ate?

St. Catherine's is a vibrant, growing, loving, caring, nurturing community of Faith. I am proud to call it my home and thankful to be a working part of its Vestry. In this coming year you will hear more about our Mutual Ministry Review we have named UPWARD. Keep your heart and mind open, be honest and candid but most of all participate so we can continue to widen St Catherine's community of Faith and search for those opportunities that will so faithfully lead us where God is challenging us to walk..

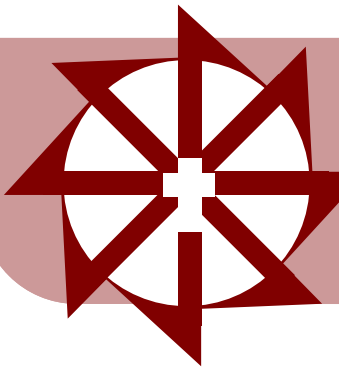
• Children of Aging Parents Group
