Native American Ministry Visit, June 14-21

Whiterocks Week is almost here! Join us to welcome 15 members of our partner parish, St. Elizabeth's in Whiterocks, Utah. St. Elizabeth's has served its community on the Ouray and Uintah Reservation for over 100 years. Since 2002, we have participated in joint activities here, there and places around the U.S.—Washington D.C. for the opening of the Native American museum, and Jamestown, Virginia, for signing of the new Jamestown Covenant.

Our visitors arrive June 14 and will be hosted in homes of St. Catherine's volunteers. Some of their activities will include boating on Lake Alatoona, touring Atlanta attractions such as the World of Coca Cola Museum and Martin Luther King Center, and a service project for our local community. Here are the parish-wide events for you to put on your calendar now!

- **Sunday, June 15: Worship together** — St. Elizabeth's will join us in worship at our 10:30 service.
- **Wed., June 18: Dinner & Culture Night** — Join us for a barbeque dinner in the Parish Hall, 6-8 pm. Our friends



Take me out the ball game!

Save this date — Tuesday July 29! We are going to Turner Field to see the Braves play St. Louis at 7:00 pm. Not all the details are worked out but we want to tell you so that you can put it on your calendar. The Fellowship Committee has rented a bus for us. The Clergy are contributing to the cause so that no one – absolutely no one – can say they can't afford to go the ball game. Watch for information and start tuning up those wind pipes for the seventh inning stretch. Why, we may even get our name in lights...

Meditative singing

During our summer worship we will introduce two new pieces of music: "The Kingdom of God" and "Eat This Bread." Both come from the community at Taize, France. "The Kingdom of God" takes its text from Romans 14:17 *For the kingdom of God is not food and drink but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit..* "Eat This Bread" takes its text from John 6:51 *Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.* Both songs will be sung during communion.

Singing Taize music is different from singing a hymn. In hymns there is a distinct beginning and end. In Taize while there is a beginning one never knows the ending – the Spirit leads that part of our singing. And the text never changes, it is repeated again and again. Taize music is not to be confused for hymns. Hymns are generally more complex, usually introducing a complete story or concept from Scripture. Taize chants take a snippet of Scripture and embed it in our hearts by repetitive refrain.

Using just a few words, the two pieces of music we will use this summer express a basic reality of faith, quickly grasped by the mind. As the words are sung over many times, this reality gradually pene-

trates the whole being. Meditative singing thus becomes a way of listening to God. It allows everyone to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive waiting on God, without having to fix the length of time too exactly.

These songs also sustain personal prayer. One of the reasons we will use them during communion is that they are easy to remember and we can all sing even while standing in line or at the rail. The organ will start us out – but there will be times when the organ will rest and come in at a later time – allowing us to find our communal voice singing the songs in the silence of our hearts as we prepare to receive the body and blood of Christ. Because the music and text are simple you will find that they infect your heart and you will begin to hear them when you are at work, speaking with others or resting. They allow us to keep on praying even when we are unaware of it. I spent 75 minutes in the security line at Atlanta's airport this past Monday. One thing that gave me peace as we inched along was Taize chants.

We hope you will enjoy singing these pieces of music and find in them a peace and serenity of the Holy Spirit.

March 2009: Visit the Burning Bush



In the Book of Exodus, Moses was forced to flee Egypt and came to live with Jethro. Moses, who shepherded Jethro's flocks, discovered the burning bush while tending the sheep. Moses approached the bush, and discovered that the bush was on fire, but the flames did not consume it. God's spirit, in the bush, then declared "I am your father's God, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." God then commanded Moses to remove his sandals, as the land was considered holy.

Found at the Monastery of St. Catherine at Sinai, what is thought to be the ancestor of the Bush Moses encountered flourishes where it was transplanted in order to build the Altar upon its roots. It is said that this is the only bush of its kind growing in the entire Sinai Peninsula, and that every at-

tempt to transplant a branch of it to another place has been unsuccessful.

The holy altar of the chapel stands not upon the sacred remains of martyrs, which is usual, but above the roots of the Burning Bush. Pilgrims enter the chapel without shoes, in remembrance of the commandment of God to Moses, "Put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground."

Join us March 13 - 24, 2009 for a pilgrimage to the Sinai and many other places as we follow in the footsteps of Moses and Jesus. The trip is beginning to fill and spaces will become limited. The deadline for registration and final payment is December 1. This will be a special time together as we seek to find God where pilgrims have gone for centuries in the same pursuit. ERD Continues Aid

Episcopal Relief and Development is working on local and international fronts to meet the needs of storm-ravaged communities. Following is excerpts from a message from Harmon B. Person, Episcopal Relief and Development coordinator for Province IV (southeastern dioceses):

Certainly you have read the articles about the massive devastation caused in Myanmar (Burma) by Cyclone Nargis. Certainly you have seen the pictures of the terrible damages caused by the earthquake in China. Meanwhile, large parts of the United States continue to be wracked by tornadoes. As Christians, most of us want to do something to help the many thousands of people adversely affected by these recent events. Thankfully, our church provides an easy way for us to help... through Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD). Let me tell you about what ERD is doing in each of these three areas.

Myanmar...Because ERD was already collaborating with Anglican and other ecumenical partners in the area (since the south Asia tsunami), funds we have already furnished have been able to be put

to use by the people who live there (not by the government)...

China... Our partner is the Amity Foundation, an independent Chinese Christian organization. With ERD's financial support, Amity has already begun providing food, bedding, and sheltering materials in some of the affected areas...

United States... ERD immediately contacted all the dioceses affected to see what their needs were. We stand ready to respond once the needs have been identified.

You may make donations directly to ERD on their website at www.er-d.org, or by mail to PO Box 7058, Merrifield, VA 22116-7058. You may designate your donation for "ERD - Myanmar Cyclone," for "ERD - China Earthquake," or "ERD - Emergency Relief Fund." Another good choice would be just to "ERD," our staff would then decide where it is most needed. ... Remember, when contributing through ERD, an exceptionally high **92% of each dollar given actually goes to help people in need.** ERD's work depends on the generosity of all Episcopalians.




