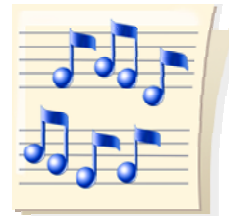

A Grand Piano for St. Catherine's

Committee fines Grounds Team just as team leader has to go on disabled list

Seems things are going from bad to worse for the St. Catherine's Grounds Team these days. One of our investigative reporters recently conducted this entirely fictitious interview with Ron Brannock who manages the Grounds Team.

Wheel: Ron, we'll ask about your piddly surgery later but first let's talk about the fine levied against your team. This is certainly bad timing when you're trying to recruit additional mowers to your outstanding team.

Ron: First of all, thanks for your overwhelming concern about my shoulder... I hope you're not part of the prayer chain. This fine is just annoyance.

Wheel: Ron, please answer my question! Why were you fined by this mysterious "committee"?

Ron: They're concerned that we only have one woman on our team of 13 mowers and want us to add at least two more. I've never turned down any applicants... we'll take anybody who can walk in a fairly straight line behind a lawnmower and who can pass our "rigorous training program." And get this... they did not stipulate a percentage requirement but just a minimum number of women on the team... so we can also add as many men as we want.

Wheel: Aren't 13 mowers enough?

Ron: Not really since I try to limit each team member to mowing one of the four sections of our grounds once per month. Mowing a section takes about one hour. So being on the team is about a one hour per month commitment for about seven months of the year. But with me being unable to mow for a while and with vacations, people needing to quit, etc., we need some more helpers.

Wheel: Why can't you get more to sign up?

Ron: I suspect it's partly because we haven't been able to raise the mowers' pay recently due to the church's budget constraints. The working conditions are pretty good. They don't have to bring anything... mowers and gas are provided. Also, they can mow on their own schedule as long as they do their section for the week anytime before Sunday.

Wheel: Yeah, but it seems this ministry would become somewhat boring.

Ron: Well, you're outside getting fresh air and exercise. Besides, I can rotate the sections so any member isn't mowing the same section all the time unless they want to ... some mowers do... I guess you think this is boring, huh?

Wheel: No, I didn't mean it that way.

Ron: Yes you did, but that's okay. Furthermore, if someone doesn't want to mow, there are several other things they can do like trimming, blowing off leaves and debris, spraying Roundup in the mulched areas, or help with special projects. The pay rate for all of these jobs is the same as for all volunteers, and I can provide all the equipment and supplies. Oh, I almost forgot to mention all the great work Gail McGill does planting and maintaining our beautiful flowers, shrubs, and trees... she could use help with planting, watering, etc.

Wheel: But don't some of these jobs take more skill than others?

Ron: Just one... periodically, I venture into the retention pond to spray Roundup on the exotic weeds residing there. We pay a higher rate to volunteer for this job because of the skill needed.

Wheel: That sounds very unpleasant...

Ron: Actually, the retention pond is quite peaceful... just you, the bugs, the weeds, and any other varmints that may be roaming around. You know, we've talked about putting in a meditation garden but we already have the retention pond...

Wheel: Eww. Do you have anything else to say before we close? Say it now since I don't think you will ever be asked to have anything in The Wheel again.

Ron: Just one more thing. Our main goal is to keep the grounds looking presentable and mowing the grass regularly is a large part of this effort. But this goal also requires that we eliminate as many eyesores as possible around the church. So if any parishioner has suggestions, we would welcome them.

Wheel: Oh, I forgot to ask about your shoulder.

Ron: It only hurts when I mow, coach.

Wellstar Study Announced

Wellstar Health Systems in Marietta is offering a screening program aimed at detecting early stages of lung cancer, in partnership with the International Early Lung Cancer Action Program and 35 other institutions in the U.S. If you're a smoker or recovering puffer and at high risk for developing lung cancer you are invited to apply. To be accepted, participants must be at least 40 years old, and be current smokers or have a history of smoking or exposure to secondhand smoke. You may not have had a chest CT scan within the past year or some diagnosed disorders or active symptoms of lung disease, and must commit to return for a follow-up CT scan in one year. CONGREGATIONAL NURSES CORNER

What is a peptic ulcer?

A peptic ulcer is a sore on the lining of the stomach or duodenum, which is the beginning of the small intestine. One in 10 Americans develops an ulcer at some time in his or her life. One cause of peptic ulcer is bacterial infection, but some ulcers are caused by long-term use of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory agents (NSAIDs), like aspirin and ibuprofen. In a few cases, cancerous tumors in the stomach or pancreas can cause ulcers. Peptic ulcers are not caused by stress or eating spicy food, but these can make ulcers worse.

Helicobacter pylori (H. pylori) is a type of bacteria which researchers believe is responsible for the majority of peptic ulcers. H. pylori infection is common in the United States. Most infected people, however, do not develop ulcers. Researchers are not certain how people contract H. pylori, but



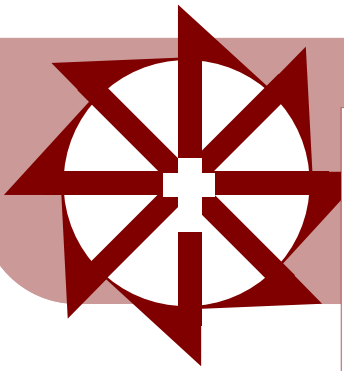
they think it may be through food or water. Researchers have found it in the saliva of some infected people, so the bacteria may also spread through mouth-to-mouth contact such as kissing.

Abdominal discomfort is the most common symptom of an ulcer. This discomfort usually:

- is a dull, gnawing ache
- comes and goes for several days or weeks
- occurs 2 to 3 hours after a meal
- occurs in the middle of the night—when the stomach is empty
- is relieved by eating
- is relieved by antacid medications

Some people experience only very mild symptoms, or none at all.

H. pylori peptic ulcers are treated with drugs that kill the bacteria, reduce stomach acid, and protect the stomach lining.
