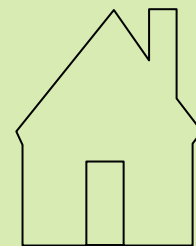

Saturday, Oct. 4, 10:00 AM

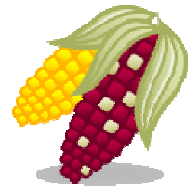

Abundance

Eight years ago I traveled to Ghost Ranch in New Mexico for a conference on Desert Spirituality. One of the places we visited was a pueblo where the Tewa Indians have lived for thousands of years. Our host was a man named Gilbert. We were guests on his small farm. He had just acquired the small tract of land. His father had given it to him. Gilbert was excited because he had been able to buy two horses. He was growing corn and various other vegetables on his farm and the horses would provide the much needed fertilizer for the land which would support his crops. The food would be harvested and Gilbert and his family would take for themselves what they needed and then donate the rest of the crop to the pueblo school and the nursing home to feed the children and the elderly.

Gilbert's father came to speak to us. He passed around a basket of small ornamental corn and invited us to take one small ear for ourselves. He then invited us to examine the corn. The corn, he said, was a gift from God. It has been provided through the generosity of nature—Mother Earth. He asked us to notice the number of seeds on **the one** ear of corn in our hand. "Count them", he said. "Now consider that each seed represents a stalk of corn. Multiply the number of ears of corn on **one stalk** by the number of seeds on each ear. Do you see now the abundance of Creation?"

I kept my ear of corn. It's in my office. When I think I don't have enough, or that I am not enough, I take it out, look at it, and try to do the math.

U.P.W.A.R.D. Update: Survey Results

Uniting Parishioners Where All Are Recognized Disciples



The Vestry has been focusing this year on the goals that were created at our annual Vestry Retreat in February. After creating the goals, each Vestry member became a part of a subgroup that had to do with either How We Talk, How We Work Together, or How We Get/Stay Involved. Based on those goals, tasks were created and questions posed to survey the congregation. The original survey report is 29 pages long. In the interest of being good stewards of our resources we will make the detailed report available through our church library rather than mail a copy to each parish family. Feel free to check out the book and if you would like your own copy, simply call the church office and one will be provided to you. Here are the highlights of the survey.

How We Talk (Improved communication to newcomers, community and congregation)

- * What is your preferred way to receive communication from St. Catherine's? (This question asked parishioners to rate each type of communication as best, good, ok, or needs improvement. E-Mail at 79% was rated the best way.)

- * How often do you visit the St. Catherine's website? (Once a month 58%, once a week 35%, 2-3 times each week 7%)

- * Do you find what you need on the website? (Yes 86%)

How We Work Together
(Ministry structure and function)

- * Have you ever been asked to participate in a ministry at St. Catherine's? (Yes 90%)

- * How would you want to be asked to volunteer at St. Catherine's? (This question asked parishioners to rate each way of being asked as best, good, ok, or needs improvement. In person at 67% was rated the best way.)

- * Were you contacted after you filled out a Time & Talent pledge card? (Yes 61%)

How We Get/Stay Involved (Ministry of invitation)

- * How did you first find/locate St. Catherine's? (Friend/neighbor 41%, Drove by 41%, Diocesan website 9%, Preschool 6%, St. Catherine's website 3%)

- * Were you greeted/welcome on your first Sunday at St. Catherine's? (Yes 97%)

- * How long have you been a member of St. Catherine's? (15+ years 39%, 10-15 years 14%, 5-9 years 27%, 1-4 years 14%, less than 1 year 3%, not a member 3%)

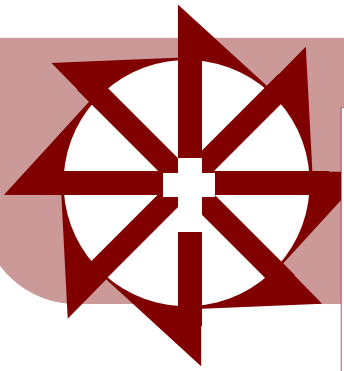
