
O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Advent brings its many responsibilities as well as a hectic-ness to which the church staff is not immune. You would think that if we preach it, pray it, read it—we'd get it. Yet Christmas looms on the horizon and there are so many decisions before it arrives. Postcard proofs fit snugly in the schedule between music decisions for the major services. Room assignments get hectic for the many activities of the church. We prepare for the generous outreach of this congregation as we struggle to keep the schedule inside these walls straight in our minds. A radio commentator was reflecting the other morning that Christmas Day remains an oasis of quiet and calm in the United States culture—a respite between 1 shopping day left till Christmas and 364 shopping days left till Christmas. Our Christmas Day worship is the most eagerly awaited in my liturgical life—perhaps a reflection on what this commentator observed about our society.

In the midst of all this, however, I do find some peace, solace and renewal each year. One source of this is our Tuesday morning Eucharist and Study during Advent. I look forward to this quiet time with

parishioners as the sun rises and brightens our sanctuary and our hearts. The other source of that peace, solace and renewal sits in a special place on my desk. And it just happens to be the reflections you write as a congregation. They await me each morning as I arrive in the office. I may not be the best at my discipline of prayer and reflection the rest of the year, but during Advent I look forward to the few minutes of peace and quiet I have each morning with your reflections. I am honored to serve a congregation that takes the time to do these reflections both for Advent/Christmas and Lent.

I just want you to know that I am fed deeply by your willingness to take Scripture and apply it to your human condition and to do so with a vulnerability and transparency that invites me more deeply into my own life as well as yours. A heart felt thanks to Gail McGill, Karen Manno and Rose Wolfe for their very capable collecting, editing and proofing of this booklet. And a deep and grateful thanks to each of you for your willingness to take the time and energy to participate—and to open yourselves to all of us.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

Our "Today's Gifts; Tomorrow's Future" Stewardship campaign continues. We currently have 195 financial commitments for 2010 for a total income of \$606,652. These two numbers (195 pledges/\$606,000) are exactly where we ended our campaign for 2009. To date there are an additional 20 households who pledged to St. Catherine's in 2009 and are yet to pledge for 2010. These represent a possible additional income of \$50,000.

The 195 financial commitments for 2010 include 31 new pledges or about 16% of the commitments. Nearly 75% of our households have either increased (54%) or maintained (21%) their pledges for the coming year. About 50% of our new commitments represent children or youth who have committed a portion of their resources to the support of our ministries. All of these numbers can be interpreted as good news.

We still have a way to go. Like everyone else our expenses are increasing in 2010 before we even consider increasing/restoring funding to existing ministries or funding new min-

istries. A budget that does not include any increase in giving (where we are right now) only means further cuts in programming, mission and ministry in order to fund fixed expenses.

What can you do? First we ask your prayers that we may remain faithful to our call as the Finance Team and Vestry fashion a budget for 2010. If you pledged last year and have not had the opportunity to return your commitment for 2010, please do so as soon as possible. If you did not make a written financial commitment last year or in previous years, please consider doing so this year. No matter the size of the gift, we are both thankful and confident you make a difference.

For every person who has participated in this year's effort, we want to thank you. Sometimes it feels like words are inadequate to express our deep thanksgiving for all that everyone does on behalf of our ministries. This is one of those times—please know how deeply grateful we are for your presence in this community and for the gifts you so freely and abundantly share. We are profoundly aware of your trust and confidence in our ability to be good stewards of your gifts.

Sarah and Tom Fulton —

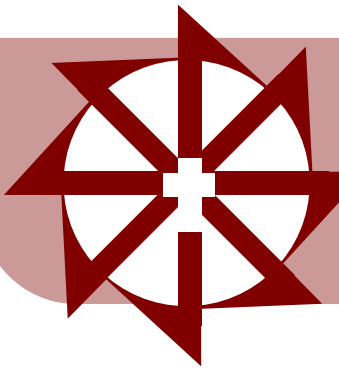
