## What is real?

Do you remember the wonderful story, *The Velveteen Rabbit*? One of my favorites. The story is about a little boy and a stuffed rabbit who ask and answer this question together, "what is real?"

I've been asking the very same question these past few days as I re-enter life at St. Catherine's. As I was reflecting on returning to the "real" world of traffic, meetings, deadlines, etc. of life in Marietta in general and St. Catherine's specifically, a friend asked me, "are you sure this is real?" Great question! It made me think! Maybe life in the slower lane as I experienced it on MacMahan Island is the real world and this world here in Georgia – or any place off that island – is some world we've created in our minds as important – but masking the real life God has given us.

The real life, then, may be a life with time

Our book this year will be *Where God Was Born: A Daring Adventure Through the Bible's Greatest Stories* by Bruce Feiler. This is absorbing blend of travelogue, history, Bible commentary, memoir, current events and passionate preaching. What differentiates Feiler from most other Bible commentators is that he actually visits the places he describes, despite suicide bombers, insurgents, fundamentalists and his very worried family back home. From a review by Warren Kelly on Amazon.com, where you can purchase the book for \$11.66, we learn it *...takes us on a journey that is both physical and spiritual. From the outset, we encounter an Israel that is very different from the one we see in Feiler's other books... The theme that seems to run through each of Feiler's books is a quest for unity in the midst of diversity. Feiler treats the Bible with great respect, often skewering liberal criticisms of the texts, but just as often questioning conservative interpretations.*

## WNL begins Sept. 23

Wednesday Night Live (WNL) is back for the fall! This year we have added a new program in consideration of our families with young children.



### Early Program — 5:00-5:45

This time is particularly designed for families who wish to arrive before dinner, have programs for both adults and children, share dinner together and get home for early bed times.

- Adult program: "Authentic Relationships" — The adults will use a small-group study from Serendipity House which "foster authentic Christian community, interactive Bible discovery, and dramatic life change." In this 13-week study of their topic, "Authentic Relationships," we will explore how to get beyond the superficial to genuine relationships. Together we'll learn how to develop friendships with genuineness, loyalty, trust, forgiveness, support, and confidence. Cost of the materials will be \$7.50 per person.

- Children's program — For kindergarten through 5th grade, ages 4-11, in the pre-school room across from the nursery. Each week a classic children's book will be read and the children will do a craft and activity based on the book.

### Evening Program — 6:30-7:30pm

Programs for all ages: adult, youth, and children!

**For Adults** — What is the importance of the storied persons in the Old Testament and Gospels? This fall we will journey through a 12 session study on Abraham, Jacob, Moses, David, Elijah, and Ruth; Peter; Mary and Martha; James, Brother of Jesus; Priscilla; Lazarus; and Mary, Mother of Jesus. Each session provides a summary of the life of the person and his or her importance in the unfolding revelatory plan of God. Just like all human beings, none was perfect, but each of their lives provides lessons that have been learned by successive generations of faithful people intent on listening for God's call and action in their own lives.

These studies will be independent so if you miss a week it won't be a problem. But, of course, as with all things the more you attend the more sense of a pattern in the stories will emerge. Who knows—we may find we have more in common with these folks than many of us might have considered.

## Grounds Team: workers wanted

Well, here's the final installment from those funny guys who are trying to recruit for the Grounds Teams.

"Rooters" – Special to *The Wheel* – September 14, 2009

"Rooters" has learned that the strike by Grounds Team Workers' Local 666 of the IBECGTW has been settled. Both sides have claimed victory. Speaking off the record, a management representative said that all along management's core issue was they would not accept a contract that had incentive compensation that was not tied to base salary. "The union has settled without a change to our current salary, bonus and benefits formula, and that's exactly what we wanted." When asked to comment, Mel Paris, one of the more vocal picketers on Sunday morning, said "We got what we wanted – a commitment to new management – the problem all along was the supervision." Another striker was overheard saying "It took three days, but it's a whole new world now!" "Rooters" was able to reach Ron Brannock, who has been at an undisclosed location throughout the negotiations, and he confirmed that he will be resigning "to pursue other opportunities." When asked to comment, Mr. Brannock said "I feel like this has been going on since the year King Uzziah died, so I'm happy to be moving on." There are rumors that the union is continuing its recruitment drive.

## Needlework Brigade Report

Sunday, September 13th at the Ministry Fair marked an exciting milestone in the Altar Kneeler project where the Needlepoint Brigade went over the 50% sponsored level. We set up the display table having seven altar rail kneelers sponsored and ended the day with six additional altar rail kneelers sponsored giving us a total to date of thirteen.

For the first time, the display area had a large graphical banner showing the altar layout and where each of the 22 kneelers will be placed and the theme of each kneeler. Eleven Old Testament kneelers and eleven New Testament kneelers were described. Adding to the interest level of those visiting our display were the first two clergy party kneelers that had been stitched and finished by our upholsterer, Corn Upholstery. These were St. Catherine and St. Mark. For the first time, the members of the congregation could see and touch the finished work of our dedicated stitchers. Susan Jablonski stitched St. Mark and Julie Brannock stitched St. Catherine.

The highlight of the day was the unveiling of the most recent canvas from our designer, Sheilah Anne Oscher of Ft. Worth Texas. It is Noah's Ark (below) and will be stitched by Courtney Shillington. And to answer the question, yes, Noah is already sponsored.



Remember, this project has no funding from the church so if it is to happen, it will be up to the members of the congregation to get behind the project and sponsor a kneeler. What better way to honor a loved one or family member?

While we were overjoyed with the results from the Ministry Fair, we need additional sponsors so that all 22 kneelers are spoken for. Please support your church by participating in this worthy endeavor. The cost is \$400 now and \$400 when it is sent to Corn Upholstery for finishing; estimated to be between 12 – 18 months from now.

## CONGREGATIONAL NURSES CORNER

*Fourth in a series of five articles on alcohol dependency by Nancy Certain, RN:*

Sometime during the middle stages of alcoholism, the alcohol dependent person loses control. As he progressively loses control over his drinking, he is no longer able to restrict it to socially and culturally accepted times and places. He often drinks more than he intended, and the drinking continues despite extremely punishing consequences. His drinking behavior can no longer be disguised as normal or even heavy drinking. His inability to stop drinking—despite his firm resolution that he will stop after one or two—is striking confirmation that he is physically addicted to alcohol.

During the middle stages of alcoholism, the addict begins to feel profound shame. Remorse, self-loathing and guilt are constant companions. They may swear to themselves, their wives, children, boss, clergymen or anyone else concerned with their drinking that they will control their intake. But their addiction makes certain that they will drink in spite of their best intentions and heartfelt promises. No wonder many of the people who observe his behavior believe that he is psychologically unstable, self-destructive and perhaps suicidal and alcohol abuser has no way of knowing that his irrational behavior is beyond his control.

Without looking through a microscope and seeing the destruction in his body, his physical dependence on alcohol can be defined as a pattern of use leading to significant impairment or distress marked by three or more of the following occurring at any time in the same 12 month period:

1. Tolerance – needing more and more alcohol to get a buzz
2. Withdrawal symptoms – tremors, nausea, headache
3. Taking the substance in larger amounts or over a longer period than intended
4. A desire or efforts to cut back
5. Large amounts of time spent obtaining, using or recovering from the substance
6. Giving up social, work or recreational activities because of use
7. Continues use regardless of its worsening of a physical or psychological problem



## Sunday Announcements: new policy



We have taken some time to reflect on the place of announcements in our worship. We believe these announcements contribute to the sense of communal responsibility for our ministry, are informative, and bring joy to our time together at St. Catherine's. As a way of being good stewards of our time, we are re-instituting announcements by individual members of the congregation with some simple guidelines:

1. The announcement must be sent to and approved by the Rector not later than Thursday afternoon.
2. You must use the microphone in making an announcement (training is free and available).
3. We ask you to keep your announcement short and to the point.
4. Only one announcement by an individual per week (in addition to Vestry Person of the Day announcements).
5. Only one announcement per activity.

## Flu Season - stay healthy!

Influenza, including H1N1 flu, is a respiratory disease that spreads from person to person. The main symptoms are fever, cough and sore throat. If you or a member of your family should show these symptoms, contact your health care provider for evaluation. You can help prevent the spread of the disease by following healthy practices such as:

- Stay home from school or work if ill, remaining at home until fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication.
- Avoid close contact with those who are ill.
- Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizers often.
- Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing with a tissue, or cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve, not your hands. Then clean your hands.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Practice good health habits, i.e., get plenty of sleep, physical activity, fluids, nutritious eating and manage stress.
- Get your seasonal flu vaccine as soon as it is available.
