Sunday, Dec. 7 Come with us to Sewanee!

On December 7 immediately following the 11:15 worship service, St. Catherine's will travel via motorcoach to Sewanee, Tennessee, to attend the 5:00 PM service of Lessons and Carols. Through music and readings, the Festival of Lessons and Carols explores themes of God's Advent and Incarnation in Jesus Christ. For almost 40 years, people have been coming to the mountaintop campus of the University of the South to attend this special choral service by the University Choir in the beautiful All Saints' Chapel. Sewanee's Lessons and Carols has been featured on television and in magazines, and is widely popular across the South.

Cost for the bus ride is \$20.00 per person

The J2A Urban Adventure

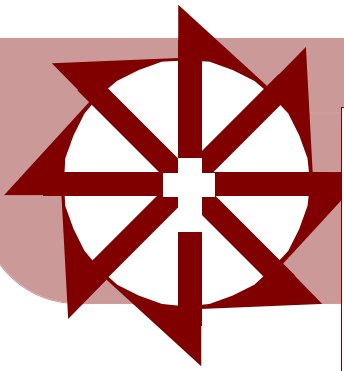
What is an Urban Adventure? The Urban Adventure is a lesson in the Journey to Adulthood Curriculum that gives each young person hands on experience in practicing the skills we use in adulthood, the skills our young people have been learning in the classroom: active listening, partnership, leadership, negotiation, research and information management, and assertiveness. The youth choose a city that is unfamiliar to them and proceed to travel in small groups around the city over a weekend without the help of silent adult chaperones, overcoming challenges that will be specifically designed to make sure each young person uses the six skills of adulthood. For instance, upon arrival in the city, a group will be faced with the immediate decision on how to get the overall group to where we'll be staying. Do they use a cab? A limousine? A train? Subway? Walk? How much will it cost? How long will it take to get there? Where is the hotel? The trip continues from there. The groups quickly learn they must work together and by working together, they meet and overcome increasingly more difficult decisions and challenges.

This is the kind of activity that changes a young person for each young person comes back more confident in who they are, having been challenged in many ways and having overcome those challenges. The group will also bond together. Once back, this group will continue to grow as the lessons in the classroom become more and more intense leading up to Confirmation and the Pilgrimage.



The J2A Youth (the 8th and 9th graders) have decided to go to Boston for their Urban Adventure over Martin Luther King weekend. The group will leave on Saturday morning, January 17 and return January 19 on Monday afternoon. The cost will not exceed \$350. A deposit for \$100 is due by Friday, November 21 in order to make airline reservations.
